SERMON TEXT- Matthew 21:33-46

[Jesus said to the people:] ³³"Listen to another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a fence around it, dug a wine press in it, & built a watchtower. Then he leased it to tenants & went to another country. ³⁴When the harvest time had come, he sent his slaves to the tenants to collect his produce. ³⁵But the tenants seized his slaves & beat one, killed another, & stoned another. ³⁶Again he sent other slaves, more than the first; & they treated them in the same way. ³⁷Finally he sent his son to them, saying, 'They will respect my son.' ³⁸But when the tenants saw the son, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir; come, let us kill him & get his inheritance.' ³⁹So they seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, & killed him. ⁴⁰Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?'' ⁴¹They said to him, "He will put those wretches to a miserable death, & lease the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the harvest time.'' ⁴²Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the scriptures: 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the comerstone; this was the Lord's doing, & it is amazing in our eyes'? ⁴³Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you & given to a people that produces the fruits of the kingdom. ⁴⁴The one who falls on this stone will be broken to pieces; & it will crush anyone on whom it falls.'' ⁴⁵When the chief priests & the Pharisees heard his parables, they realized that he was speaking about them. ⁴⁶They wanted to arrest him, but they feared the crowds, because they regarded him as a prophet.
