SERMON TEXT- Leviticus 19:1-2, 15-18

¹The LORD spoke to Moses, saying: ²Speak to all the congregation of the people of Israel & say to them: You shall be holy, for I the LORD your God am holy. ¹⁵You shall not render an unjust judgment; you shall not be partial to the poor or defer to the great: with justice you shall judge your neighbor. ¹⁶You shall not go around as a slanderer among your people, & you shall not profit by the blood of your neighbor: I am the LORD. ¹⁷You shall not hate in your heart anyone of your kin; you shall reprove your neighbor, or you will incur guilt yourself. ¹⁸You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against any of your people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the LORD.

LISTENING TO ...

GOD- Christian life is rooted in the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit

- 1. How does the refrain "I am the LORD" root the Israelites' behavior in God, not themselves? By the way, review the Golden Calf incident to see what happens when we look within/give into ourselves (*see Exodus 32*). *See Exodus 19:5-6, 20:2, 8-11; Deuteronomy 6:20-25, 7:6, 26:18-19; Isaiah 61:6; Romans 6:12-23; Ephesians 2:12-13; 1 Peter 2:9*
- 2. Leviticus contains the worship instructions for the Israelites. What does this add to your understanding of holiness in everyday life as worship? What does St. Paul add? Romans 12:12; 1 Corinthians 3:16, 6:19-20; 2 Corinthians 6:16-18; Ephesians 2:1-22, 6:18; 1 Thessalonians 5:17; see also 1 Peter 2:5

EACH OTHER- Sharing & growing with our brothers & sisters in Christ

- How does our modern attitude of "settle it & let the insurance take care of it" violate v15? What about "sweetheart deals" for celebrities, politicians, & the well-connected? Review 7th Commandment in both the <u>Small*</u> & <u>Large Catechisms*</u>
- Review the proper Lutheran teachings in <u>Formula of Concord- Solid Declaration</u> IV:7-12* about good works. What stands out to you? What's new to you? Do you disagree with any of it?

(Oh, how pastors hate overhearing "We should be nice to this [high-income] family so they'll go to our church!" *cf. Matthew 19:23-26.*) When a neighbor, colleague, friend, or classmate asks why you do acts of kindness, generosity, mercy, goodness, etc. how do #4, 5 above help you explain that 1) it's who God made you to be & 2) Jesus' return to judge the living & the dead is imminent? See Romans 13:11-14
