SUMMARY OF TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS -THE LAST SUNDAY OF THE CHURCH YEAR

By Faith We Are Prepared for Christ's Return "The day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night." (1 Thessalonians 5:1-11) The arrival of the bridegroom will be sudden and unexpected. Therefore you are to be watchful and ready like the five wise maidens. "For you know neither the day nor the hour" (Matthew 25:1-13) when the Son of Man is to return. The lamps are the Word of Christ. The oil in the lamps is the Holy Spirit, Who works through the Word to create and sustain the flame of faith in Christ in us. The foolish are those who do not give proper attention to the working of the Holy Spirit in Baptism, preaching, and the Holy Supper, and so their faith does not endure. The wise, however, are those who diligently attend to these gifts of the Spirit, and who therefore have an abundance of oil. The flame of faith endures to the end. By God's grace they are received into the eternal wedding feast of the Lamb in His Kingdom, the new heavens and the new earth created by the Lord for the joy of His people. (Isaiah 65:17-25) (lcms.org/lectionary-summaries)

READING FROM THE LUTHERAN CONFESSIONS

Summary: Christ defeated death by His resurrection from the dead and brings victory over death to us in Holy Baptism.

Baptism promises and brings victory over death and the devil, forgiveness of sin, God's grace, the entire Christ, and the Holy Spirit with His gifts. Think about it. Imagine there was a doctor somewhere who understood the art of saving people from death or, even though they died, could restore them quickly to life so that they would afterward live forever. The world would pour in money like snow and rain. No one could find access to him because of the throng of the rich! But here in Baptism there is freely brought to everyone's door such a treasure and medicine that it utterly destroys death and preserves all people alive.

We must think this way about Baptism and make it profitable for ourselves. So when our sins and conscience oppress us, we strengthen ourselves and take comfort and say, "Nevertheless, I am baptized. And if I am baptized, it is promised to me that I shall be saved and have eternal life, both in soul and body." By Baptism we are made holy and are saved. No other kind of life, no work on earth, can do this. *(lemssermons.com; The Large Catechism, Part 4, Baptism)*

APOSTLES' CREED (CONFESSION OF FAITH) [PAGE 12]

HYMN OF THE DAY: 5 609

SERMON: BE TRUE TO JESUS, NEVER FALSE TO HIM, FOR HE'S EVER-FAITHFUL AND TRUE TO YOU – MATTHEW 25:1-13

"Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour." (Mt. 25:13) Amen.

Grace and peace to you in the Lord Jesus Christ, the "Alpha and Omega...Who is and Who was and Who is to come, the Almighty." (Rev. 1:8) Amen. Jesus' Parable of the Five Wise and Five Foolish Maidens asks us, "What's the difference between the five who are wise and the five foolish ones?" To answer this, consider the challenge of finding the one person, animal or object in a drawing that differs from all the rest in just one, small way. Oftentimes, it's only after a painstaking visual search that we find the one aspect that distinguishes one person, animal or thing from all the rest.

If we apply this to the ten bridesmaids in the parable, intently studying each of them, what do we see that tells them apart? All ten virgins are awaiting the joyful hour of a wedding celebration, and all ten carry oil lamps. It's only after examining the picture further that our eyes catch oil flasks next to five of the women. That's the only difference; and it's a big one! It's why Jesus calls five of the maidens foolish and the other five wise. Those who are wise have oil for their lamps – as all of them should!

Knowing that the oil of the five wise maidens represents a living faith in Jesus – by the Holy Spirit, we see just how crucial it is for the bridal virgins to have oil and how bad it is for them to lack it.

So Matthew 25:1-13 sifts all true Christians on earth from the false ones – or those who merely appear to be Christians outwardly, but inwardly aren't.

The Lord Jesus speaks of such false Christians in Matthew 7:21-23: "Not everyone who says to Me, Lord, Lord,' will enter the Kingdom of Heaven, but the one who does the will of My Father Who is in Heaven. On that day many will say to Me, Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in Your Name, and cast out demons in Your Name, and do many mighty works in Your Name?" And then I will declare to them, I never knew you; depart from Me, you workers of lawlessness.""

So these workers of lawlessness, who also have no oil for their lamps, are cast out of the Lord's presence forever – even though they're more-than-certain that they're "shoe-ins" for heaven. These fakes certainly used Jesus' Name to prophecy, cast out demons from people and do other mighty works – all the while not actually believing in the Lord Jesus or honoring His Name one bit. So that all who've heard them prophecy and who've had demons cast out of them by these phonies have benefited greatly, while these workers of lawlessness themselves don't benefit at all from this.

2 Timothy 3:2-5 also speaks of pretend followers of Jesus, describing how, in the last days, they'll be "lovers of self, lovers of money." They'll be "proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient, ungrateful, unholy, heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, haters of discipline, brutal, not loving good, treacherous, reckless, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God." They'll "have the appearance of godliness, but will deny its power." So to all eyes they'll be as Christian as St. Peter. But to God they'll be as rotten and loathsome as Herod, Pilate and Judas.

The five foolish virgins will almost always "fool" others with their "fake faithfulness" to Christ; they'll even fool themselves, but they'll never fool God as He alone sees and knows the heart, *(see Lk. 16:15)* and He can't be mocked. *(See Gal. 6:7)*

Those who try to pass themselves off as Christians "in their [false] security think that, by themselves and their works, they are worthy of God, and that for this reason they are accounted righteous by Him." (Apology of the A.C., Art. 3, Par. 200) Like all true Christians must, they ought to "return to [the Lord] with all [their] heart, with fasting, with weeping and mourning" (Joel 2:12) over their sin and wretchedness. But they don't. What sin; what wretchedness? they ask. They need to seek the forgiveness of their trespasses in the precious wounds of Christ the Savior every day. But they won't make any appeal to Him to have mercy on them, to blot out their transgressions, to cleans them thoroughly of their iniquity. (See Ps. 51:1-2)

How imposter Christians need to hear the Word of Christ like faithful Mary, sitting as she does at Jesus' feet so as to take in and "*live...by every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord.*" (*Deut. 8:3*) Yet they scorn the teaching of the Lord like Mary's sister, Martha, does, dismissing it as background noise; not treasuring it as the Word of Life. (See Lk. 10:38-42)

How great is their need to faithfully eat and drink of the Lord's Supper! Yet they spurn His altar, so that they're rarely-to-never found here. Or they come to the Lord's table like feral hogs eating among the cow herd – not caring about the presence of Jesus' body and blood in His Holy Meal. They refuse to acknowledge their sin-guilt, thinking they have no need for Christ to cleanse them with His own flesh and blood. So that the blessing of the Sacrament is lost to them.

The five wise maidens – representing the righteous people of God – are regarded as holy by Him not because of they themselves – their own goodness or fulfilling the Law, but rather for Christ's sake alone, through faith in Him alone. For Jesus has reconciled God the Father to us by His innocent suffering and death as the spotless, innocent Lamb of God Who takes away the sin of the world. *(See Jn. 1:29)*

What a true, priceless, eternal treasure we have in godly faith in Jesus Christ, worked in us by the Holy Spirit! What is this but faith in the certain forgiveness of sins in Jesus' Name. As it's written: "Blessed is the person whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered." (Ps. 32:1) And also, "Blessed is the person who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in Him." (Jer. 17:17)

No one should use the *Parable of the Ten Maidens* as a "faithful-or-faithless" meter, or as a means to try to determine whether a person is really a Christian or not. Only God sees and knows the heart; only He can-and-will separate the wheat from the weeds on the day of judgment. Until then, the wheat and the weeds grow together and look alike.

And who can say, really, which is which? We'll only know for sure when the weeds are pulled up and cast into the fire in judgment, while the wheat is harvested unto eternal life. Or when the five wise maidens enter into the marriage feast with Christ the Bridegroom – their lamps ablaze, while the rest are locked out in utter darkness forever.

What this parable does do is warn all of us who call ourselves Christians to never just "put on a religious show" before God and to each other – to never draw near to God with our lips while our hearts are far from Him. (See Is. 29:13) But to be absolutely sure of what we're to believe – that "Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is [our] Lord." (S.C., 2nd Art. Expl.) And to trust in Him and worship Him with all our heart!

The Rev. C.F.W. Walther, first president of our Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, was approached one day by a member of his congregation – a woman in despair. She told Pastor Walther what a lousy person she was, how she made a regular mess of her life, how she hurt other people, how her Church attendance stank, and so how she feared that she was no longer a Christian. Pastor Walther heard her out. Where she saw herself being a waste to God, Rev. Walther saw her as a Christian woman whose sins had deeply hurt her and others; whose guilt was unbearable. This even made her ashamed to come to Church. Walther reminded the woman of her Baptism, comforted her from God's Word and absolved her of her sins in Jesus's Name, for she was repentant, contrite. He comforted her that she was, and would always be, a beloved, blood-bought daughter of God – and so a Christian through-and-through.

Rev. Walther encouraged the woman to return to regular, faithful Divine Worship, for there she'd certainly receive all of Jesus' saving gifts and would be in the good company of fellow sinners redeemed by Christ the crucified. No one should ever deprive himself or herself of Jesus, His Word and Sacraments, and the fellowship of his or her fellow saints in God's sanctuary! For this is bad – very harmful for the soul! "Blessed are they [blessed are you] who dwell in the House of the Lord, ever singing His praises!" (Ps. 84:4)

Pastor Walther went on to comment that his real concern wasn't for those like the woman who come with troubles, hurting hearts or with fears, dreading that God is against them – needing His tender mercy. Such people seek what they really need: Christ, His love and forgiveness; His restoration and salvation. And the assurance that they haven't lost their faith, but are still believers in Jesus. What troubled Walther was those who are unconcerned about their sin-guilt, who think they're as-good-as in heaven already, who have no real struggle with their sins, with the world and with the devil, and who don't think they need to hear and heed God's Word all-that-often, or to be fed by Him at His altar much or at all.

The Parable of the Ten Maidens is finally a call for us to be faithful to the Lord unto death as it prepares us to finally depart this world with trusting hearts. By it we see that we are to properly prepare for our own death "because we do not want to be like those who do not have oil in their lamps when the Bridegroom comes and calls us. (See Mt. 25:3) We [pray to God] that in the last hour of this life we may have true repentance, the Word, the Sacraments, faith, hope, and the spirit of grace and prayer. We ask for these things so that when we are to die, we may be found in Christ.... In this we rightly commend our souls into the hands of our Father. We ask that our death may be a deliverance from all evil and a passage out of this vale of misery to eternal life." (Treasury of Daily Prayer: Rev. Martin Chemnitz, 11/9) Amen. The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.

O Holy Spirit, create in us humble hearts and lead us daily to repent of all our sins. Turn our thoughts continually from worldly matters to our Father in Heaven and to His Son, our Savior, Who will come one day to take us to Himself. Fill our hearts with the love of Christ so that we, in turn, love each other. What great joy is ours as we look forward to the blessed day when our Lord and Savior will appear in glory to raise the dead and judge the world! On that day we shall finally be delivered from this vale of tears. May our joy never diminish and our faith never weaken. As the Spirit of Truth and Divine Counselor, Whom Christ promised to His Church, strengthen us during this time of watching and waiting. Praise and honor be to You, O Holy Spirit, for Jesus' sake. **C: Amen.**

Give them patience in their suffering, strengthen their faith, heal them according to Your good and gracious will, and keep their eyes fixed on Your Son, their Savior, in Whose Name we pray. **C: Amen.**
