SUMMARY OF TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS – THE SECOND SUNDAY IN THE SEASON OF ADVENT

The Lord Comes on the Last Day The day on which our Lord returns will be a "great and awesome day" (Malachi 4:5) as He will come back for us in a cloud with great power and glory. To the wicked and the proud, it will be a Day of judgment that will "set them ablaze." (Malachi 4:1) The signs preceding this Day will bring them fear and fainting. But to those who believe, who fear the Name of the Lord, this Day is one to look forward to and to rejoice in: "Straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." (Luke 21:28) Christ our Redeemer is coming; the Sun of Righteousness will bring healing in His wings. Let us, then, give attention to the words of the Lord, which do not pass away. Let us "through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures" (Romans 15:4) be strengthened in our hope by the Holy Spirit and watch diligently for Jesus' coming. Then, by God's grace, we

shall escape all these things that will come to pass and stand before the Son of Man joyfully. (lcms.org/lectionarysummaries)

READING FROM THE LUTHERAN CONFESSIONS

Summary: Your redemption is drawing near, and you know that the Kingdom of God itself is near, not only on the Last Day, but even in the Holy Supper of our Lord.

Christ's human nature, after the resurrection from the dead, is exalted above all creatures in heaven and on earth. He did not lay aside His human nature, but retains it to eternity. He has the full possession and use of the divine majesty according to His assumed human nature. However, He had this majesty immediately at His conception. As the apostle testifies (Philippians 2:7), He laid it aside. He kept it concealed in the state of His humiliation and did not always use it, but only when He wanted to use it.

Now Christ has ascended above all heavens. (Ephesians 4:10) He also truly fills all things, being present everywhere, as God and man. He rules from sea to sea and to the ends of the earth, as the prophets predicted. (Psalm 8:1, 6; Zechariah 9:10) This happened according to the way things are done at God's right hand, which is not a set place in heaven. It is nothing other than God's almighty power, which fills heaven and earth. Christ is installed according to His humanity, without confusion or equalizing His divine and human natures in their essence and essential properties. By this communicated divine power, according to the words of His testament, Christ can be and is truly present with His body and blood in the Holy Supper. *(lemssermons.com; SD FC, Article 8, The Person of Christ)*

SERMON: TAKE COURAGE IN YOUR FAITH IN CHRIST; LOOK FOR HIS COMING; NEVER FALL AWAY – LUKE 21:25-36

"Now when these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." (Lk. 21:28) Amen.

Grace and peace to you in the Name of your coming King. Amen. "The end of the Church Year, culminating in the Last Sunday [after Trinity two weeks ago], focused our attention on the coming of the end of the world in judgment." On this Second Sunday in Advent, "we shift our focus to the One Who is coming in that judgment, as well as remembering that He comes to us in a very special way in the Means of Grace and that He came to us in time in Bethlehem as a baby born of Mary." (pericope.org; Seasonal Intro. to Advent)

Advent is a promise as well as a warning. It's a promise of redemption. It's a warning of judgment. Judgment Day is the day of the Christian's redemption and the day of the non-Christian's damnation. Just as surely as Christ Jesus redeemed us by His blood at his *First Coming*, He'll surely judge the living and the dead at His Second Coming. Those who have repented of their sins and have trusted in their Savior Jesus – Who bore away all their sin on the cross, washing it away by His blood – will welcome Christ's Second Advent as the day of their final redemption. Those who've continued in their sin and have rejected God's grace in Christ Jesus will be terrified at His Second Advent. Their hearts will fail for fear.

The powers of heaven will be shaken. The world that we know – that looks like it'll last forever – will be destroyed. The orderly universe will fall into disarray. This won't be a natural disaster or a man-made disaster – neither a global-killing meteor strike nor numerous nuclear weapon blasts. God alone will accomplish it with His almighty power. Just as He destroyed the world by a flood and destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah with fire and brimstone, so will He destroy the world in which we live.

Hearts whose affections are attached to the cares and pleasures of this life will fail from fear. They think this world will last forever. They think that if there's ever a reckoning they must face, they'll have time to prepare for it. Not so. They fail to face the fact that they owe their Creator devotion and obedience. They live as if He doesn't care about what they say or do, or as if He's disinterested in life on earth or is powerless here. Jesus describes these people when he warns us not to let our hearts be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness and the cares of this life. For this is what the worldly are doing, and they think for all the world that all will end well for them.

It's not as if all those who'll be absolutely terrified at Jesus' return don't believe that God exists. The problem is that they live as if He's not true God since they lack godly faith in Him. They live to get pleasure and avoid pain. *"Carousing, drunkenness, and the cares of this life" (Lk. 21:34)* are a summary of those concerns that concern people who aren't concerned about God. They don't pay attention to what He says. They don't know or care about what really matters in life. They think that their bodily comfort, pleasures, pains and cares matter most. They look around and see what others have that they want to get and what others suffer that they want to avoid. What God says is all very good, but it goes in one ear and out the other. They scoff at God's call to genuine repentance and to true faith in His Son. They replace the one true God with a generic, one-size-fits-all god who can accommodate himself to anyone's religious sensibilities.

Jesus will return, confirming the truth of His identity, of Christianity. It will be shown then that *Judgment Day* isn't a scare tactic to get people to behave. It's a certainty. All Christian doctrine that seemed so distant and irrelevant will then be so vivid and real, staring everyone in the eyes. There won't be any doubt about it anymore. Jesus has said

so. That settles it. The *Second Coming of Christ* is as certain as His *First*. Just as surely as Jesus came into the world in humility to redeem us all, every bit as surely will He return in glory to gather us to Himself. The *First Advent* guarantees the *Second*. Those who receive Jesus as He comes in humility are ready to receive Him when He comes in glory. Those who do not are not.

The reason the hearts of unbelievers will faint from fear is because when they see the universe shaken down to its foundations and the end of all things at hand, they'll know for sure that they're facing their just Judge and they haven't got a leg to stand on. They'll be overcome by terror because they'll know the truth which they dismissed. They'll know that putting their confidence in worldly things which perish was not only foolish, but a terrible sin against God, Who alone is all that matters. The destruction of the world will catch them as a snare catches an animal in the woods. No warning. One moment it's running along entirely unconcerned. The next moment it's trapped. There'll be no escape.

And so our Lord's message to us today is to never fall in with those who – at His *Final Coming* – will be filled "*with fear and with foreboding of what is coming on the world.*" (*Lk. 21:26*) For to join in with those who're unprepared for Christ's *Final Advent* and the earth's destruction is also to join with them in eternal judgment in the lake of fire. This calls for daily repentance, daily dying in Christ to sin and death on our part, and daily rising in Him to forgiveness, peace with God, and the guarantee of enteral life in-and-with the Lord Jesus. About this repentance, it can't be rare or occasional, or only when we think or feel we need it. Because if turning from sin; seeking forgiveness in Christ is infrequent, sporadic in our lives, then it's not really valued or considered all that important or necessary, is it?

Real repentance is being terrified by your sins and the just judgment you deserve for them all. But this is absolutely necessary as it leads you all-the-more so to trust Christ's Holy Absolution: His declaration that all your sins are taken away, eradicated from you by His innocent suffering and death as your Redeemer. The changed life always follows godly repentance and forgiveness. And since you'll remain a sinner 'til your dying breath, you'll need to repent many times over – all your days here on earth. So "repent and turn from all your transgressions." Never stop doing so, "so that your iniquity will not become your downfall." (Ez. 18:30) Always "draw near to God, and He will draw near to you" (James 4:8) in mercy and peace.

That day of reckoning is coming, but for those who have their refuge in the wounds of Jesus, it'll be a day of joy, not one of retribution. *Judgment Day* will be our *Redemption Day!* As we sing to the Lord, the world's doomsday will be for us *"the day of earth's redemption, that brings us unto Thee!" (TLH 72:4)* The *Last Day – Christ's Day* we should call it, will be the day of our final deliverance from these dying bodies, our last deliverance from the sin that lies within us, our full and final deliverance from this fallen, cursed world; this veil of tears.

Saints of God, "we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Holy Spirit, groan inwardly as we eagerly await our adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. For in this hope we are saved." (Romans 8:22-24)

The Rev. Luther writes of our Gospel lesson, comforting us with the words of Christ: "Those who have believed in Me, suffered for My sake, and died in faith in Me need have no fear. Those who have not believed [should] be afraid, but you need not fear.... If the world is to crash in ruins, there must first be some cracking and bursting; otherwise such a great structure [as our world is] cannot collapse. Everything must shake and sway...."

"Therefore I tell you, don't fear, but lift up your heads, like people who rejoice to see it, for, see, your redemption is near. Be of good cheer; it will indeed be a terrible sight, but it is not against you but against the devil and unbelievers. To you salvation is come and the joy of redemption, for which you have so long been sighing and praying, that My Kingdom might come to you, cleansing you from all your sins and redeeming you from all evil. What you have so long been praying for with all your heart shall then be given to you." (Sermon on the 2nd Sunday in Advent, 1544; WA 52:19)

This, brothers and sisters in Christ, is why we will compromise anything else, let go of everything else, and concern ourselves with nothing else but holding on to God's precious Word, confessing it in its entirety as Divine Truth, compromising not one word of it, listening to it as if our lives depend on it, because they do. And resting our hope in Him Who came in great humility to redeem us, so that when He comes again in glory as the great and almighty Judge of all the earth, we may behold Him as our loving and merciful Redeemer, our all-compassionate Lord God and Savior. Amen. *The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.*
