# SUMMARY OF TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS – SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER/ASCENSION OF OUR LORD

The Ascended Lord Jesus is with Us Always in His Church on Earth After He rose from the dead, the Lord Jesus presented Himself alive to the apostles, "appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the Kingdom of God." (Acts 1:3) When He ascended to the right hand of the Father, He did not orphan His Church, but He fills all things in heaven and on earth and gives gifts to His disciples. Even now, through His Church, He continues "to do and teach," (Acts 1:1) preaching "repentance for the forgiveness of sins," (Luke 24:47) even "to the end of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

Though the cloud hid Jesus from the sight of His disciples then, and He remains hidden from sight even now, He remains with His people through His Gospel and Sacraments. He comes to us by the word of His apostles, by the promise of His Father and by the power of the Holy Spirit, whom He pours out upon "the Church, which is his body." (Ephesians 1:22–23) In this holy Christian Church, we bless God and worship Christ with joy, for in His Church He blesses us with forgiveness, lifts us up in His hands and seats us with Himself "in the heavenly places." (Ephesians 1:20) (lcms.org/lectionary-summaries)

### A READING FROM THE LUTHERAN CONFESSIONS

Summary: Jesus' Ascension to "the right hand of God" was not about leaving His people behind. It was about departing from sight to fill the whole world while remaining hidden in it amidst His holy Christian Church. There He rules over His people as His Holy Spirit works amongst baptized believers to keep them with Him through His Word and Sacraments.

Our Churches teach that the Word, that is, the Son of God (ref. John 1:14), assumed the human nature in the womb of the blessed virgin Mary. So there are two natures – the divine and the human – inseparably joined in one person. There is one Christ, true God and true man, Who was born of the virgin Mary, truly suffered, was crucified, died, and was buried. He did this to reconcile the Father to us and to be a sacrifice, not only for original guilt, but also for all actual sins of mankind. (Ref. John 1:29) He also descended into hell, and truly rose again on the third day. Afterward, He ascended into heaven to sit at the right hand of the Father. There He forever reigns and has dominion over all creatures. He sanctifies those who believe in Him, by sending the Holy Spirit into their hearts to rule, comfort, and make them alive. He defends them against the devil and the power of sin. The same Christ will openly come again to judge the living and the dead, and so forth, according to the Apostles' Creed. (Augsburg Confession, Article 3: The Son of God)

- 1) What Book is the only source of Christian Doctrine, or our teaching and belief? **The Bible**
- 2) What is the Bible? It is Divine Truth, the inerrant Word of God, incapable of being wrong.
- 3) What is the purpose of God's Law? The Law reveals our sins, makes us repentant and teaches us how to lead a God-pleasing life.
- 4) What does the Gospel teach? The Gospel teaches that God has eternally saved us through the death and resurrection of His Son, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
- 5) What is the summary of the First Table of the Law (Commandments 1-3)? "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." (Matthew 22:37)
- 6) What is the summary of the Second Table of the Law (Commandments 4-10)? "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:39)
- 7) What is the wages of sin? "The wages of sin is death." (Romans 6:23)
- 8) What Bible verse declares all men to be sinners? "All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)
- 9) How are we made free from sin and the condemnation of the Law? By faith alone in Jesus Christ

**SERMON** Christ Ascends to Cap Off Your Salvation – Luke 24:44-53

"While [Jesus] was blessing [His disciples], He left them and was taken up into heaven." (Lk. 24:51) Amen.

Grace, mercy and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Amen. Christ your dear Savior has died for all your sins. Jesus is risen; He's ascended far above all heavens, in order to fill all things. (See Eph. 4:10) Your Savior is coming again for you – soon! Hallelujah!

Forty days following His ascent from the grave, which couldn't possibly hold Him, Jesus also ascends in glory to the right hand of His Father – the position of all power and might – all "glory and honor, praise, adoration." (Beautiful Savior: 4) Let's dig into our Lord's ascension on high for us as it's declared to us in Holy Scripture alone – and as we faithfully believe and profess in our Lutheran Confessions, our Book of Concord. Let's see just how Jesus is Lord not only of the cosmos and all things in existence, but is also our own dear Lord and Savior. Let's hear how He – in His blessed ascension – has all authority in heaven and on earth (see Mt: 28:18) – as Ruler of all. Let's see how He now "always lives to make intercession for [us,]" (See Heb. 7:25) His beloved saints. How He's present in His flesh and blood upon all altars that confess Him, and how He has exalted our fallen humanity in His glorified humanity.

In the blessed event in time known as His ascension, our Lord Jesus once more demonstrates that He Himself is our good Lord. St. Peter the Apostle proclaims to all the devout Hebrews assembled on the *Day of Pentecost*, to us and to the whole world: "[The Lord] Jesus God raised up [from the dead], and of this we are all witnesses, being therefore exalted at the right hand of God." (Acts 2:32-33) "Let [it be] therefore know for certain that God has made Him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus Whom you crucified." (Acts 2:36) Truly, Christ the Son of God is our holy, blessed Lord from eternity! Yet St. Peter declares that – in Jesus' death for us, in His resurrection from the dead and ascension into heaven for us – God has made Him both Lord and Christ or Messiah, meaning that He's your Lord in His death, resurrection and ascension for you. This is so since these three combine to accomplish your deliverance from death, devil and hell, granting you eternal life, God as your beloved Father and heaven as your glorious home!

The Rev. Dr. Luther in the Large Catechism would have us focus intently on Jesus' very important title — "Lord" — which we confess in the Creed: "[We believe] in Jesus Christ, [God's] only son, our Lord..." Luther says that as our Lord, Jesus is our Redeemer. That is, "He Who has brought us from Satan to God, from death to life, from sin to righteousness." Luther declares that all the points which are to be found in the Second Article of the Apostles' Creed express nothing other than the redemption that our Lord Jesus has won for us. How that redemption was accomplished, how much is cost the Lord Jesus, "and what He spent and risked that He might win us and bring us under His dominion" (Large Catechism, Art. 2 of the Creed, 31) — that is our faith; that is our life, our salvation, our joy!

According to Luther, what we confess in the Creed is: "Namely, that [the Son of God]...suffered, died and was buried, that He might make satisfaction for [us] and pay what [we] owe, not with silver nor gold, but with His own precious blood. And all this, in order to become [our] Lord; for He did none of these for Himself, nor had He any need of it. And after that He rose again from the dead, swallowed up and devoured death, and finally ascended into heaven and assumed the government at the Father's right hand, so that the devil and all powers must be subject to Him and lie at His feet, until finally, at the last day, He will completely part and separate us from the wicked world, the devil, death, sin, etc." (LC, Art. 2 of the Creed, 31)

Jesus' ascension therefore completes the "circuit of our salvation," ushering in His glorious rule and reign and assuring His Final Return. That the Lord Jesus assumes the government at the Father's right hand means that all "blessing and honor and glory and might" (Rev. 5:13) has been bestowed on Him by His Father forever! Christ the Lord has authority over all things, especially His dear Church: "With His own blood He bought her, and for her life He died." (The Church's One Foundation: 1)

See with what holy ardor and affection the Lord pleads for us, His beloved Church, while still on earth! And if He prays so fervently prior to His ascent into heaven, how much more does He now always live to make intercession for us whom He's saved and has drawn to God! (See Heb. 7:25) During His earthly ministry, our Lord prayed for all those whom His Father would give Him, that we and all our fellow Christian saints would be united as one in the Christian faith even as Jesus and His heavenly Father are forever united as one God, one Lord, together with the Holy Spirit. And so our Lord Jesus pleads for His disciples, for us and for all God's people. He pleads for you still before His Father and yours in His ministry of intercession for His dear Bride, the Church! What does He plead for on your behalf? That you continue to always be set apart by God as holy and righteous in His sight. On what basis? On the basis of His self-sacrifice alone for you! His holy, precious blood shed for you; His sacred body given unto death for you.

Christ's sanctifying mercy which He works in you in driven home in the Lutheran Confessions: "He...truly rose again the third day; afterward He ascended into heaven that He might sit on the right hand of the Father, and forever reign and have dominion over all creatures, and sanctify them that believe in Him, by sending the Holy Spirit into their hearts, to rule, comfort, and [enliven] them, and to defend them against the devil and the power of sin." (Augsburg Confession, Article 3)

"He Who descended is the very One Who [also] ascended above all the heavens, in order to fill all things." (Eph. 4:10) Our risen and ascended Lord is more-than-able to be present everywhere He desires in His humanity according to His divine majesty. Truly, the vast expanse of earth can't contain He Who built the starry skies (See, Amid the Winter's Snow: 2); He Who's enthroned above the cherubim! (See Is. 37:16) "[W]e also believe, teach, and confess that it was not a mere man who suffered, died, was buried, descended to hell, arose from the dead, ascended into heaven, and was raised to the majesty and almighty power of God for us, but a man whose human nature has such a profound [close], [inexpressible] union and communion with the Son of God that it [has become] one person with Him." (Formula of Concord: Epitome) "Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at the same time both God and man." (Augsburg Confession: par. 28)

Given this wondrous truth, we believe from Holy Scripture that our Lord is present with us and active in our faith-lives in and through His Holy Word as well as His Holy Sacrament of the Altar. So that, according to the power of

His divine nature, He's able to be, and is truly, bodily present upon His altar, feeding us His own precious body and blood from there for our forgiveness, life and salvation.

Lastly, by His own exaltation in the flesh in His resurrection and ascension, your Lord Jesus also exalts you in your body! He says to you, "Because I live, you will live also." (In. 14:19) Exalted before the Father in your blood-bought body by your risen, ascended, glorified Savior, you can confidently declare: "I shall not die [and perish eternally in hell,] but I shall live, and proclaim what the Lord has done!" (Ps. 118:17) So live day-by-day in Jesus, very well-prepared, eagerly awaiting His return, for "Christ shall openly come again to judge the [living] and the dead..., according to the Apostles' Creed." (Augsburg Confession, Article 3) Amen. The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.
