SUMMARY OF TODAY'S DIVINE SERVICE READINGS – TWELFTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY

Faith Comes from Hearing A man who was deaf and therefore also had an impediment in his speech was brought to Jesus. (Mark 7:31-37) In the same way, all are by nature deaf toward God and therefore also unable to confess the faith rightly. For "faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." (Romans 10:9-17) Jesus put His fingers into the man's ears, and He spat and touched His tongue. Even so in Holy Baptism, water sanctified by the words of Jesus' mouth is applied to us; and the finger of God, that is, the life-giving Holy Spirit, is put into our ears in the hearing of the Baptismal Gospel. Jesus' sighing "Ephphatha" opened the man's ears, and his tongue was loosed to speak plainly as Isaiah prophesied of the Messiah: "In that day the deaf shall hear the words of a book." (Isaiah 29:18-24) So also, He Who sighed and breathed His last on the cross for us has given us to hear and believe in Him and has opened our lips so that our mouths may declare His praise. (Icms.org/lectionary-summaries)

A READING FROM THE LUTHERAN CONFESSIONS

Summary: A sinner cannot come to know or believe in God by his own free will any more than a deaf man can will himself to hear. Jesus used His fingers and saliva to open up a deaf man's ears and loose his tongue. He also uses the preached Word and Sacraments to open up dead hearts and loose tongues to confess sins and faith in Christ.

We believe, teach, and confess that the unregenerate will of mankind is not only turned away from God, but also has become God's enemy. So it only has an inclination and desire for that which is evil and contrary to God. Romans 8:7 says, "The mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God's Law; indeed, it cannot." Just as a dead body cannot raise itself to bodily, earthly life, so a person who by sin is spiritually dead cannot raise himself to spiritual life. So it was that "when we were dead in our trespasses, God made us alive together with Christ." (Ephesians 2:5)

It is God's will that His Word should be heard and that a person's ears should not be closed. With this Word the Holy Spirit is present and opens hearts, so that people pay attention to it and are converted only through the Holy Spirit's grace and power, Who alone does the work of converting a person. For without His grace, and if He does not grant the increase, our willing and running, our planting, sowing, and watering are all nothing. As Christ says in John 15:5, "Apart from Me you can do nothing." The Spirit denies free will its powers and ascribes everything to God's grace, in order that no one may boast before God. (Icmssermons.com; Formula of Concord: Epitome, Article 2: Free Will)

We therefore draw near to You in all our bodily and spiritual needs, for there is no one to help us but You alone. We humbly implore You to touch with Your divine power our diseased members and our corrupt hearts, to open our ears to hear Your Word, to loose our tongues to speak Your righteousness and to fill our hearts with the power

of Your Holy Spirit, that, beholding the wonders of Your grace, we may confess Your Name before men and praise and glorify You, Who does all things well, and Who lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

SCRIPTURE LESSONS: OLD TESTAMENT LESSON - ISAIAH 29:17-24

P: ^{29:17} Is it not yet a very little while until Lebanon shall be turned into a fruitful field, and the fruitful field shall be regarded as a forest? ¹⁸ In that day the deaf shall hear the words of a book, and out of their gloom and darkness the eyes of the blind shall see. ¹⁹ The meek shall obtain fresh joy in the Lord, and the poor among mankind shall exult in the Holy One of Israel. ²⁰ For the ruthless shall come to nothing and the scoffer cease, and all who watch to do evil shall be cut off, ²¹ who by a word make a man out to be an offender, and lay a snare for him who reproves in the gate, and with an empty plea turn aside him who is in the right.

²² Therefore thus says the Lord, Who redeemed Abraham, concerning the house of Jacob: "Jacob shall no more be ashamed, no more shall his face grow pale. ²³ For when he sees his children, the work of my hands, in his midst, they will sanctify My Name; they will sanctify the Holy One of Jacob and will stand in awe of the God of Israel. ²⁴ And those who go astray in spirit will come to understanding, and those who murmur will accept instruction."

P: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

EPISTLE LESSON – ROMANS 10:9-17

P: ^{10:9} If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. ¹¹ For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in Him will not be put to shame." ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing His riches on all who call on Him. For "everyone who calls on the Name of the Lord will be saved."

¹⁴ How then will they call on Him in Whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in Him of Whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? ¹⁵ And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!" ¹⁶ But they have not all obeyed the Gospel. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?" ¹⁷ So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

But the more He charged them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. ³⁷ And they were astonished beyond measure, saying, "He has done all things well. He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."

SERMON: OPEN OUR EARS, LORD, TO ALWAYS HEAR, BE SAVED BY AND CHERISH YOUR WORD – MK. 7:31-37

"[Jesus] has done all things well. He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak." (Mk. 7:37) Amen.

Grace and peace to you in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. How good and gracious of the Only-Begotten of the Father – God the Son, to heal a deaf-and-mute man of his disabilities! When Jesus healed another man who was blind from birth, His disciples asked Him why the man was born this way. The Lord answered that this happened so that "the works of God might be displayed in him." (John 9:3) The same holds true in our Gospel for today as the works of God are definitely displayed so that all may believe and rejoice in the divine restoration of a man's hearing and speaking.

The Lord Jesus heals the deaf-mute and performs many other wondrous, mighty miracles to show – beyond-a-shadow-of-a-doubt – that He's indeed God's Holy, Anointed Messiah long-promised by Him and, at long-last, sent by God to redeem His people to Himself. God's prophets had foretold that His chosen Servant would come to do such great and glorious things as restore the sight of the blind, the hearing of the deaf, the walking ability of the paralyzed and even raise the dead to life again! So Christ Jesus fulfills the Old Testament Scriptures in Mark 7 and many other places in the Gospel accounts. He does so to demonstrate His divine power and to restore His fallen creation.

Christ also heals the man in order to open his ears and mouth to hear God's Word, believe in Him and confess Jesus as his Lord and Savior.

Our Redeemer's healing power further points to our final, perfect restoration in the Age to Come – after He's returned for us to raise us unto everlasting life and bliss. Since the Lord doesn't currently heal people in the way He healed the deaf-mute-man in our text – making the disabled and the diseased instantly well again, we know by His Word and our faith that He'll perform such a tremendous miracle again on every one of us when He calls us forth, alive from our graves, by name.

The words of our Old Testament lesson are important not only because they're divine revelation – God's living, saving voice for needy sinners, but also because they foretell what God's anointed Servant will do for the life-long and eternal well-being of His people. What the deaf-mute man's companions and others witness is Christ the Lord keeping the prophetic promise that God will restore hearing to the deaf. As Jesus puts his fingers in the man's ears; as He dabs a bit of His saliva on the man's tongue and cries out, "Ephphatha" – an Aramaic word meaning, "Be opened," (Mk. 7:34) Isaiah 29:18 is fulfilled! "In that day the deaf shall hear the words of a book...."

So too are the words of Isaiah 35 fulfilled, where the prophet describes how the coming of the Lord will cause the desolate wilderness to rejoice and blossom like a crocus. (V. 1) This sudden life and growth out of nowhere will occur as people see "the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God." (V. 2) The weak-hearted and the anxious will be fortified and comforted because their mighty Deliverer "will come and save [them]." (V. 4) Isaiah 35:5 then triumphantly declares: "Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened...."

That Jesus is God's Messiah Who has perfectly fulfilled the words of Isaiah 29, 35 and every other Old Testament prophecy about Him is a Biblical and historical certainty – unquestionable, irrefutable. It's to be believed by all people – especially by you, God's holy people! So always believe in your Messiah; always profess Him as your Lord and Savior! For your Messiah was chosen by God His Father. He was sent to you as God-and-man in one person;

anointed with the Holy Spirit without limit. He strove with all His might to undo the ruin, death and destruction we all brought upon ourselves by our rebellion and fall. He rescued us from the devil and his claim on us, and He redeemed us out of this decaying, dying world unto a new heaven and earth where everlasting righteousness dwells! (See 2 Pet. 2:13)

Your Savior has already begun to restore His fallen creation – corrupted, mortally-wounded by our own evil fault, but all-the-more regenerated, revived by His gracious will and work. How so? By His coming to earth for you and for all people. By His preaching God's Truth; by His healings and many other marvelous miracles; by His loving, serving, suffering and dying for you; for all! By His glorious resurrection from the dead and His awe-filled ascension on high. And by the ministry of God the Holy Spirit throughout the Age of the Church, in which He "calls, gathers, enlightens and sanctifies [countless many to be His] Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith." (Small Catechism: Explanation of the 3rd Article of the Creed) Your Savior will fully restore you as His new creation in the endless, glorious life and world-to-come!

Deaf as he is, the man in our Gospel reading can't hear Jesus and so believe in Him, since "faith comes by hearing... the Word of Christ." (Rom. 10:17) Unable to speak, he can't audibly confess Jesus as his Lord and praise His Holy Name. So Jesus heals the man to take care of both these problems. Now he can "hear the words of a Book" (Is. 29:18) – the Torah, the Word of the Lord...especially as Christ Jesus speaks it into him, giving him the forgiveness of sins, faith, new life in Him forever!

Has the Lord Jesus done any less for you? While you're not deaf, unable to speak like the man in Mark 7, you were formerly "spiritual deaf" to God's Word, and unable, unwilling to confess Jesus as your Lord. So He came to you to heal your ears of the deafness of unbelief, to open your mouth to boldly confess Him as the Lord your God, and to call upon Him in prayer, praise and thanksgiving. Jesus came to restore you to God, to make you whole by the Word of His mouth – and that Word joined with water. "Praise God for His glorious grace, with which He has blessed you in His beloved Son!" (Eph. 1:6)

Rather than let you keep on resisting His Word of faith in unbelief, your Savior took it and implanted it in your heart, through your ears. By it He has "redeemed [you], a lost and condemned person, purchased and won [you] from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil...with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death." (Small Catechism: Explanation of the 2nd Article of the Creed)

While you no longer dismiss God's Word, your sinful nature works in you to not always wholeheartedly embrace it as you ought to, as you need to. "Oh, how I love Your Word [O Lord!]" (Ps.119:97) are words we speak to God, and we mean it! Yet we can also be, and are, distracted, diverted from the living voice of our Savior by the cares and desires of this life. (See Mk. 4:19) This always calls for godly repentance on our part.

So be turned from words which the world and your sinful heart want you to hear. Be turned to God by His very Word of Life which you sometimes value less than you should. Don't forsake your Shepherd's call, His rod and staff and gracious presence! Lay your disinterest in, your neglect of God's Word on Christ your Redeemer. For He suffered, died and was buried for you to pay for, to cover your sin in full. He gave His life to open your ears every bit as much as He opened the ears of the deaf-mute man. So that you "confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, [and you are] saved!" (Rom. 10:9)

We may wonder why our Lord doesn't perform miraculous healings nowadays like He did in Bible times. Following Jesus' ascension and the deaths of His holy apostles, His mighty signs and wonders came to an end, but only for the time-being.

Jesus' New Testament miracles actually point to what heaven will be like for us. If you think about it, the deaf-mute man and others whom Jesus healed on-the-spot got an early taste of what eternal life with God will be like. This benefits us tremendously in that we hear and read of Jesus' miracles, we believe that He worked them for people in need, and we trust that He'll also perform a wondrous miracle for us in our need. For when our bodies have wasted away and are buried dead-as-can-be, how will our ears hear again, our eyes see anew, our hands touch and our mouths breathe and praise God once more unless Jesus calls us to life again, forever? For He "will transform our lowly body to be like His glorious body, by the power that enables Him to subject all things to Himself." (Phil. 3:21) At that time you'll experience exactly what the deaf-mute experienced when Jesus was so good to him. Amen. The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.
