FEAR FOR ALL

I am a Turkish soldier. I was scared but determined to fight for my country, this is my story.

The cold frosty silence stung my lungs as I gazed down the tumbling steep hills, the rocks jutted out like the bayonets we used to kill many. I still remember the crimson stained battle field, fresh and slick with blood. But the relief, the silence, so raw, so fresh, of victory. I remember watching the strangers, the young boys just like me, fleeing onto their wooden boats like marching ants in surrender.

I am an ANZAC. A brave and honoured man in the army. I was trembling as we went on the boats, the swirling feeling of regret and fear stirring deep within me. This is my story.

I remember fleeing on to our ironbark boats, leaving behind our mates that died with bravery. I remember the day when we shared stories of life in the trenches, of our lives back home with the Turkish soldiers, but the next day it was back to bloodshed and that day it was manys last. But that was the past, we were going home to see our wife's and children and friends. we were going home

This was our story, we were both soldiers with family and hope. We were young, we did not want to kill, but did we have a choice? We all wanted freedom, we all wanted safety, we all wanted this war to end. Whether we had medals or badges, we were all glad to return to the warm hugs at doorsteps. but many open arms were left cold like ice for, for those they love, now rest in Gallipoli.

We will remember them


