SUBJECT: Resolutions No. 19 and No. 20, Series 2020 – establishing a State of Emergency and an Electronic Participation Policy discussion

PROCEDURE: Board of Trustees Discussion/Action Item

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND OF SUBJECT MATTER:

On March 23, 2020, the Silt Board of Trustees approved Resolution No. 19 pursuant to 24-33.5-709 CRS declaring a local disaster emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. It also passed Resolution No. 20 adopting an electronic participation policy for use in a local emergency. At its May 11 regular meeting, the Board asked that these resolutions be included for discussion in the next Board meeting.

It should be pointed out that the Emergency Ordinances on this meeting agenda are made possible because the Board had enacted the State of Emergency. It may be necessary to enact additional ordinances related to the pandemic in the future.

**TOWN OF SILT
RESOLUTION NO. 19
SERIES OF 2020**

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SILT, COLORADO, IN SUPPORT OF THE GOVERNOR DECLARING A STATEWIDE EMERGENCY AND AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES, DECLARING A LOCAL DISASTER EMERGENCY, AND AUTHORIZING THE EXERCISE OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES' POLICE POWER BY THE TOWN ADMINISTRATOR.

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization has declared the 2019 Novel Coronavirus/ COVID-19 disease ("COVID-19") a Global Pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has spread and infected populations at such a rate throughout the United States, the State of Colorado, and the western slope of Colorado that it threatens to overwhelm limited medical facilities with infected individuals; and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States of America has declared a National State of Emergency relating to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Colorado has declared a statewide emergency regarding the occurrence or imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic on March 10, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the cost and magnitude of responding to and recovery from the impact of COVID-19 may be in excess of the Town's available resources; and

WHEREAS, the Town may need to expend resources not previously budgeted or approved; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest for the Town to have emergency resources available to work to safeguard the health and safety of the community; and

WHEREAS, it would be appropriate and in the interests of the public health and safety, and would further protect property, for the Town to support the State and Garfield County in their efforts to respond to the emergency; and

WHEREAS, pursuant C.R.S. § 24-33.5-709 the Board of Trustees or Town Administrator is authorized to declare a local disaster emergency; and

WHEREAS, C.R.S. § 31-15-401(b), grants the governing bodies of municipalities the police powers "[t]o do all acts and make all regulations which may be necessary or expedient for the promotion of health or the suppression of disease"; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees finds that it is in the best interest of public health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of Silt to declare a local disaster emergency relating to the COVID-19 pandemic, authorize the Town Administrator to expend certain funds in response

efforts, and furthermore authorize the Town Administrator to exercise the Board of Trustees' police powers to suppress the transmission of disease.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SILT, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1. The Board of Trustees hereby declares pursuant to C.R.S. § 24-33.5-709 that there is a local disaster emergency in Silt, due to the imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property resulting from COVID-19 requiring emergency action to respond to and protect the life, health and safety of the citizens of Silt.

Section 2. The effect of such declaration shall be to authorize the furnishing of aid and assistance under all applicable local and interjurisdictional disaster emergency plans.

Section 3. The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to expend funds in response to the emergency not to exceed \$100,000 without prior Board of Trustees approval provided that such expenditures are ratified by the Board of Trustees within 30 days. The Town Administrator is further authorized to suspend or modify the adopted policies of the Town including, but not limited to, procurement and employment in order to respond to COVID-19.

Section 4. The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to "[t]o do all acts and make all regulations which may be necessary or expedient for the promotion of health or the suppression of disease" relating to the COVID-19 pandemic, including the exercise of the Board of Trustee's police power pursuant to C.R.S. § 31-15-401(b). In the event of such exercise by the Town Administrator of the Board of Trustees' police powers, the Board of Trustees shall adopt a resolution ratifying such actions taken within three days. In the absence of a resolution ratifying the actions taken, such actions shall be void.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such declaration shall be effective from the date of the declaration until the Board of Trustees determines an emergency no longer exists. Two copies of the declaration will be filed promptly with the Colorado Office of Emergency Management.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE
TOWN OF SILT, COLORADO, ADOPTING AN
ELECTRONIC PARTICIPATION POLICY FOR USE IN THE
EVENT OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY DECLARATION.**

WHEREAS, the Town of Silt ("Silt" or the "Town") is a home-rule municipality organized under Article XX of the Colorado Constitution and with the authority of the Silt Home Rule Charter (the "Charter"); and

WHEREAS, Charter Section 2-10 (d) provides that the Board of Trustees "may designate an alternate place for such meeting and post notice thereof as provided in" the Charter; and

WHEREAS, Charter Section 2-10 (e) provides that the meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be open to the public.

WHEREAS, Neither the Charter nor the ordinances of the Town prohibit electronic participation in Town Board meetings; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 24-33.5-709 of the Colorado Revised Statutes, the Town Administrator and Town Board have authority to declare a local disaster or emergency; and

WHEREAS, Town government must continue to operate during a local disaster or emergency, while taking measures to protect the health and welfare of its employees and officials; and

WHEREAS, It is the intent of this resolution to permit the functions of the Town Board of Trustees to continue in the event of an emergency declaration; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees has determined that it is in the best interest of the public health, welfare, and safety of the residents of the Town of Silt to adopt an Emergency Electronic Participation Policy.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SILT, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1. The above recitals are hereby incorporated as findings by the Town Board of Trustees of the Town of Silt.

Section 2. The Town Board of Trustees of the Town of Silt hereby adopts the Emergency Electronic Participation Policy, attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

Section 3. The Electronic Participation Policy adopted herein shall only apply upon the adoption of a resolution by the Town of Silt Board of Trustees declaring a local disaster emergency or the Town Administrator declaring a local disaster emergency pursuant to Section 24-33.5-709 of the Colorado Revised Statutes.

**ELECTRONIC PARTICIPATION POLICY
AT BOARD OF TRUSTEE MEETINGS DURING A LOCAL DISASTER EMERGENCY**

I. Purpose.

The purpose of this Policy is to specify the circumstances and means under which the Board of Trustees shall conduct regular and special meetings by telephone or other electronic means of participation, such as video-conferencing that is clear, uninterrupted and allows two way communication for the participating members ("Electronic Participation"). Electronic Participation has inherent limitations because Electronic Participation effectively precludes a member of the Board of Trustees from contemporaneously observing documentary information presented during meetings; from fully evaluating a speaker's non-verbal language in assessing veracity or credibility; and from observing non-verbal explanations during a speaker's presentation or testimony. The Board of Trustees finds that these limitations, inherent in Electronic Participation, may produce inefficiencies in meetings, increase the expense of meetings, and alter the decision-making process. As such, the Board of Trustees shall only utilize the policies contained herein upon the adoption by the Board of Trustees of a resolution declaring, or the Town Administrator declaring, a local disaster emergency pursuant to Section 24-33.5-709, Colorado Revised Statutes.

II. Statement of General Policy.

The Board of Trustees or Planning Commission may conduct a regular or special meeting by electronic means only in accordance with this Policy.

A. Emergency Situations.

In the event a quorum is unable to meet at the day, hour, and place fixed by the rules and procedures of the Board of Trustees because meeting in-person is not practical or prudent due to an emergency affecting the Town, meetings may be conducted by telephone, electronically, or by other means of communication so as to provide maximum practical notice. Meetings may be held by telephone, electronically, or by other means of communication if all of the following conditions are met:

1. A local disaster emergency has been declared pursuant to Section 24-33.5-709, Colorado Revised Statutes; and

2. The Town Administrator or the Board of Trustees determines that meeting in person is not practical or prudent, because of matters related to the declaration of local disaster emergency affecting the Town; and

3. All members of the Board of Trustees, and at least one Town staff member can hear one another or otherwise communicate with one another and can hear or read all discussion and testimony in a manner designed to provide maximum notice and participation; and

4. Members of the public can hear the Board of Trustees's proceedings and are afforded opportunities to participate in public comment; and

5. All votes are conducted by roll call; and

6. Minutes of the meeting are taken and promptly recorded, and such records are open to public inspection; and

7. To the extent possible, full and timely notice is given to the public setting forth the time of the meeting, the fact that some members of the Board of Trustees may participate by telephone, and the right of the public to monitor the meeting from another location.

III. Arranging for Electronic Participation.

A. The Town Administrator shall contact Council members at least twenty-four hours in advance of a regular or schedule meeting to provide notice of a meeting conducted under this policy.

B. The Town shall initiate the Electronic Participation not more than ten (10) minutes prior to the scheduled time of the meeting. Upon disconnection during a meeting, the Town Clerk shall make at least three attempts to re-initiate the connection.

IV. Effect of Electronic Participation.

A. Quasi-Judicial Matters.

In the event that a pending application is scheduled for a public hearing that is quasi-judicial in nature at a meeting at which this policy is in effect, the Town shall advise the applicant of such circumstances and present the applicant with options for proceeding with the application. The applicant shall authorize the Town, in writing, to proceed with one of the following options.

1. Conduct the public hearing under this policy with accommodations made for electronic public participation; or

2. Suspend any and all review and decisions deadlines until such time that the local disaster emergency is lifted and the Board of Trustees schedules a regular meeting at which a quorum will be physically present.

B. Executive Sessions.

In the event that the Board of Trustees holds an executive session pursuant to Section 24-6-402, Colorado Revised Statutes and Section 4.10 of the Silt Home Rule Charter, participants shall be authorized to attend via Electronic Participation. Any executive session conducted under this policy shall be recorded electronically as provided for by statute.

V. Limited Applicability of Policy.

This Policy shall only apply to regular and special meetings (including work sessions) of the Board of Trustees and Planning Commission of the Town of Silt. For the purposes of the Planning Commission's use of this policy, the word "Council" shall mean "Commission".

VI. Reasonable Accommodations.

The Town shall provide reasonable accommodation and shall waive or modify provisions of this Policy to provide handicapped members of the Board of Trustees and Planning Commission full and equal access to Board of Trustees and Planning Commission meetings.

Ordinance 14, Series of 2020: **AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 9.08.010 TO ALLOW CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN DESIGNATED PUBLIC PLACES**

PROCEDURE: Public Hearings

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND OF SUBJECT MATTER:

The purpose of these items are to allow the Town to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic and the devastating economic impact it is having on the Town's restaurants.

1. Currently, municipal code does not allow alcohol consumption on Town streets. Proposed Ordinance 14 will permit the Town to temporarily allow alcohol consumption in areas the Town Administrator deems appropriate in order to assist restaurants in recovering from the pandemic.

The idea is to allow patrons to take their carryout food and drinks to an approved area and consume them there. This would include alcohol consumption.

An example of such an area is 8th Street between Main and the alley between the Miner's Claim and Silt Senior Housing. It will be blocked to vehicular traffic and used as an appropriately 'social distanced' area with tables where people can gather to eat and drink "take-out" food and drink.

2. Additionally, the State of Colorado's Liquor Enforcement Division is refining guidance that would allow local liquor licensing authorities to temporarily extend liquor licensed premises to encompass larger areas for the purpose of opening restaurants and seating customers in more socially distanced ways.

Ordinance 13 provides the Town with an administrative decision-making process to temporarily extend liquor licensed premises in Silt.

In that the State is likely to require some kind of "inclement weather" provision, the Town may install one or more of its festival/event tents on the street or in private parking lots within the Town.

It is staff's belief that this will increase patronage of the local restaurants, supporting them economically as well as providing an opportunity for our residents to 'dine out' thereby supporting our resident's mental and emotional well-being.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval of these extraordinary ordinances after an appropriate discussion with the Board of Trustees.

**AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROVAL PROCESS FOR
AN APPLICATION REQUESTING A CHANGE OF LOCATION OF PREMISES
UNDER AN EXISTING LIQUOR LICENSE FOR USE DURING A LOCAL
EMERGENCY DECLARATION**

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Colorado declared a statewide emergency regarding the occurrence or imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic on March 10, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Garfield County and the Town of Silt (“Silt” or the “Town”) declared a state of emergency for their respective jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the Town is a home-rule municipality organized under Article XX of the Colorado Constitution and with the authority of the Silt Home Rule Charter (the “Charter”); and

WHEREAS, Section 1-12(a) of the Town’s Home Rule Charter grants authority to the Board of Trustees to enact emergency ordinances in the event of an emergency that requires an immediate action for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety by the affirmative vote of every member of the Board present or by affirmative votes equal to a quorum plus 1, whichever is less; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5.25.020 of the Silt Municipal Code, the Town Board is the local liquor licensing authority; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5.25.030 of the Municipal Code, the Town Clerk currently serves as the official secretary of the liquor licensing authority, attends the meetings of the authority, and assists the authority in receiving applications, coordinating with officers and departments when relevant and exercising her discretion in forwarding applications and permits to the liquor licensing authority as appropriate; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5.25.070 of the Municipal Code, applications for a change of location of premises under an existing liquor license are granted or denied by the liquor licensing authority after a hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Colorado Department of Review has adopted Emergency Regulation 47-302(F) to allow establishments with on-premises liquor licenses to apply for a temporary modification of premises to expand their licensed premises into sidewalks, streets and parking lots to increase social distancing measures while being able to operate a productive and economically sustainable business; and

WHEREAS, to stimulate the recovery of businesses in the Town while preserving public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Town of Silt during the COVID-19 pandemic, the Board of Trustees desires to enact this emergency ordinance to temporarily delegate authority to the Town Clerk to review and approve, without a hearing, liquor license applications for a temporary change of location of premises to allow or extend outdoor seating of existing on-premises liquor license establishments; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SILT, COLORADO, THE FOLLOWING:

Section 1. Findings and Intent. The above and foregoing recitals are incorporated herein by reference and adopted as findings and determinations of the Town Board of the Town of Silt.

Section 2. Grant of Authority to Town Clerk. The Board of Trustees of the Town of Silt hereby grants temporary authority to the Town Clerk to review and approve an application of an existing licensee for a change of location of premises to allow or extend outdoor seating. This authorization shall be effective immediately and shall continue through September 30, 2020 unless otherwise extended or modified.

Section 3. Application for Temporary Change of Location of Premises. An application for a temporary change of location of premises must be submitted to the Town Clerk on state forms with required fees; a document from the owner of the premises confirming the licensee has permission to use the premises (use of Town property requires a license from the Town); and diagrams showing the premises before the change and after the change. The diagram showing the premises after the requested change of location must depict how the applicant intends to contain the expanded area to ensure alcohol remains within the expanded area as required by applicable liquor laws and regulations. The temporary change of location of premises, if approved, shall remain in effect through September 30, 2020 and shall automatically expire effective October 1, 2020.

Section 4. Emergency Declared; Effective Date; Expiration. Pursuant to Section 1-12 of the Town Charter, the Board finds, determines and declares that passage

of this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety. Once bars and restaurants are allowed to reopen, the temporary measures herein will permit establishments with on-premises liquor licenses to resume operations while maintaining social distancing measures through an expedited administrative procedure. The Board of Trustees further determines that the adoption of this Ordinance as an emergency ordinance is in the best interest of the citizens of the Town. Pursuant to Section 1-12, this Ordinance shall be effective upon adoption. The measures adopted by this Ordinance shall expire effective October 1, 2020, unless repealed prior to that date.

**AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 9.08.010 TO
ALLOW CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN
DESIGNATED PUBLIC PLACES**

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Colorado declared a statewide emergency regarding the occurrence or imminent threat of widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic on March 10, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Garfield County and the Town of Silt (“Silt” or the “Town”) declared a state of emergency for their respective jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the Town is a home-rule municipality organized under Article XX of the Colorado Constitution and with the authority of the Silt Home Rule Charter (the “Charter”); and

WHEREAS, Section 1-12(a) of the Town’s Home Rule Charter grants authority to the Board of Trustees to enact emergency ordinances in the event of an emergency that requires an immediate action for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety by the affirmative vote of every member of the Board present or by affirmative votes equal to a quorum plus 1, whichever is less; and

WHEREAS, the Colorado Department of Review has adopted Emergency Regulation 47-302(F) to allow establishments with on-premises liquor licenses to expand their licensed premises into public areas including sidewalks, streets and parking lots to increase social distancing measures while being able to operate a productive and economically sustainable business; and

WHEREAS, to stimulate the recovery of businesses in the Town impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic while maintaining social distancing measures, the Board of Trustees desires to amend the Municipal Code to allow for consumption of alcohol beverages in designated public places in the Town.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SILT, COLORADO, THE FOLLOWING:

Section 1. The above and foregoing recitals are incorporated herein by reference and adopted as findings and determinations of the Town Board of the Town of Silt.

Section 2. Section 9.08.010 is hereby amended by the addition of the following paragraph C:

9.08.010 – Open containers

C. Notwithstanding the prohibition above, alcoholic beverages, including, but not limited to, fermented malt beverage, vinous, or spiritous liquor, may be consumed and possessed in an open container in any other public place in the town as designated in writing by the town administrator from time to time. The town administrator shall cause appropriate signage to be erected in such public places.

Section 3. All bylaws, orders, resolutions and ordinances, or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency

Section 4. If any section, subsection, clause, phrase or provision of this Ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, shall to any extent, be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unconstitutional, the remaining sections, subsections thereof to any person or circumstance, shall remain in full force and shall in no way be affected, impaired or invalidated.

Section 5. Emergency Declared; Effective Date; Expiration. Pursuant to Section 1-12 of the Town Charter, the Board finds, determines and declares that passage of this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety by ameliorating the negative effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on establishments with on-premises liquor licenses while maintaining social distancing measures. Pursuant to Section 1-12, this Ordinance shall be effective upon adoption.
