
Prayer huddles

Getting Started

Understanding a statement

- Have someone read aloud 1 John 5:4-5.
- Write on the chalkboard: "Faith is the victory that overcomes the world."
- Ask members to analyze the statement and rephrase it, using different words. For example, they may suggest something like: "Dependence on Christ is how we defeat temptations we face in life," or "Trusting Jesus enables us to win when everyone else wants us to lose," or "Christians avoid spiritual defeat by leaning on Jesus."
- Have members brainstorm areas in which Christians must battle worldly influences. They may suggest some of these:
- o unwholesome entertainment
- o political correctness
- o universalism

- exaltation of "toleration"
- o peer pressure
- o children's peer pressure
- desire for things and success
- o ungodly legislation
- o legislation against godly values and actions
- o ridicule of Christian beliefs and values
- After several are listed, ask volunteers to choose one and tell how faith enables a Christian to have victory in that area. Allow three or four volunteers to do this.

Teaching outline

• Write the following teaching outline on the chalkboard, or a large sheet of paper.

A Christian's Assurance 1 John 5:1-12

- Assurance of Relationship (v. 1-3)
- Assurance of Victory (v. 4)
- Assurance in the Son of God (v. 5-10)
- Assurance of Eternal Life (v. 11-12)
- Use the outline to guide the study of the passage. The following are elaborations on each outline point for your study.

• Assurance of Relationship (vv.

1-3). We can be sure that we are born of God if we believe that Jesus is the Christ, if we love the

Father and the Son, if we are living a life of obedience to God.

• Assurance of Victory (v. 4). If we are born of God, we are assured victory over the world. This victory is a result of our faith in Jesus.

O Assurance in the Son of God

(vv. 5-10). We can be sure that Jesus is the Son of God because of three witnesses of the water (Jesus' baptism and God's affirmation of Him as His Son), the blood (Jesus' crucifixion and God's affirmation of Him through the resurrection), and the Spirit (given to Jesus at His baptism to empower His earthly ministry, promised by Jesus to His followers). In addition, believers testify that Jesus is the Son of God, a truth they know in their hearts.

• Assurance of Eternal Life (vv.

11-12). The eternal life offered by God is resident in His Son, Jesus. Those who have Jesus have the life. Therefore, believers can have

total assurance of their salvation and eternal life.
