



# WORD BREAK

020 – LIVING A PRAISE FILLED LIFE (#7 TEHILLAH)

Dear Child of God,

Welcome to “WORD BREAK” #20, which is designed to give you a nugget from God’s Word to strengthen your daily walk. GOD is looking for people on the earth who will consistently praise Him.



**Today, let’s take a look at word #7 called tehillah .**

This word is pronounced (teh-hil-law'), and means laudation, a hymn, or a song of praise. This word is derived from our previous word halal; while tehillah has a different meaning than halal, it carries the same flare and intensity as halal. This is an intense spontaneous praise that flows out of a person’s heart at the moment; it is unrehearsed, and completely born out of your spirit man with the aid of the Holy Spirit. Many times, you may need to start out with a shabach or a halal, but will ultimately end up in the awesome Holy Spirit anointed flow of the tehillah. During this time a believer on the earth has accessed music that is actually going on at that very moment in Heaven. It is during these times that Heaven literally comes to earth.

The tehillah is the only type of praise that God actually enthrones. Enthroned means to sit in a place associated with a position of authority or influence. In other words, every time you enter into tehillah praise, God comes into your midst and sits down in a mighty position of authority and influence. When God’s authority and influence is released in your life, the problems you are facing will change into God’s solutions.

This is exactly what happened in 2 Chronicles 20:21-23.

*“21 And when he had consulted with the people, he appointed those who sang to the LORD and those who praised (halal) Him in holy attire, as they went out before the army and said, “Give thanks (yadah) to the LORD , for His lovingkindness is everlasting.” 22 And when they began singing and praising (tehillah), the LORD set ambushes against the sons of Ammon, Moab, and Mount Seir, who had come against Judah; so they were routed. 23 For the sons of Ammon and Moab rose up against the inhabitants of Mount Seir destroying them completely, and when they had finished with the inhabitants of Seir, they helped to destroy one another.” (NASB)*

Notice, they started praising God with the halal and the yadah; however, it was not until the spontaneous anointed tehillah praise was released that God destroyed the enemy.

Because the tehillah is such a high level of praise, we will need to take a further look at this word next week.

I pray that right now as you get alone with God, and begin to praise Him with your lips, that God will lead you into the powerful realm of the tehillah praise.
