024- LIVING A PRAISE FILLED LIFE (A Review)

Dear Child of God,

Welcome to “WORD BREAK” #24, which is designed to give you a nugget from God’s Word to strengthen your daily walk.

GOD is looking for people on the earth who will consistently praise Him.

Today, let’s review these powerful Hebrew words for praise.

- 1) Yadah (yaw-daw) means to open or extend your hands to God. (Psalm 54:1-7)
- 2) Towdah (to-daw) means to extend the hands with thanksgiving. (Psalm 100:4a)
- 3) Shabach (shaw-bakh) means to address in a loud tone. (Psalm 63:1-3)
- 4) Barak (baw-rak) means to kneel, to bless, to praise, and to be blessed. (Psalm 34:1)
- 5) Zamar (zaw-mar) means to touch the strings or various parts of a musical instrument, to play upon an instrument, or to make music that is accompanied by the voice; this word also means to celebrate in song or music. (Psalm 108:1&2)
- 6) Halal (haw-lal) means to praise, to glory, to celebrate, to sing (praise), to boast, to rave, to make a show, and to be clamorously foolish. (2 Chronicles 20:19)
- 7) Tehillah (teh-hil-law) means laudation, a hymn, or a song of praise. It is an intense, spontaneous praise that flows out of a person’s heart at the moment. This kind of praise is completely unrehearsed, and is born out of a person’s spirit by aid of the Holy Spirit. (2 Chronicles 20:22)
- 8) Ruwa (roo-ah) means to mar by breaking, and to split the ear with sound. (Joshua 6:16)
