## **How to Become an Early Response Team Member (ERTs)**

One of the primary ways the Central Texas Conference responds to disasters is via our Early Response Team (ERT). Our CTC ERTs respond to disasters within the conference, as well as to help other areas facing disasters. The mission of an Early Response Team is to provide a caring presence in the aftermath of a disaster, under very specific guidelines that enables a team to be productive and caring while causing no further harm or being a burden to the affected community.

If you are called to service as a member of the CTC ERT, you'll need to register for and participate in one of the trainings taught throughout the year. These trainings are taught by "authorized" UMCOR trainers, and team members are given authorized ERT ID badges from UMCOR as evidence of completing the training.

The next Emergency Response training opportunity will be:

9am to 5pm on Saturday, September 7th at Central UMC in Waco, Texas

Here are the basic qualifications for one to become a certified Early Responder with the Central Texas Conference:

Complete the basic class, led by an authorized trainer:

- Pass a background check done by the conference office (usually related to "Safe Sanctuaries")
- Score 70% or higher on the ERT basic class quiz (found in the manual)

## "COMING SOON: LORD'S ACRE DAY" SEPTEMBER 28TH—ALL DAY!


Lord's Acre Day started at this church in 1957 when some dedicated church members wanted to raise money for the church.

Different forms of donations came in and were auctioned off. At our previous location a pen was set up on the parking lot with livestock. George Ogelsby donated a calf that had to be rounded up in the mud! (Just remember if you bring any live animals, be prepared to take them back home if the auctioneer doesn't sell them.) Wallace Cockerham donated bales of cotton. He brought samples to be bid on and then delivered the full bales. Beautiful handmade furniture & pieces of needlework have always been 'heated' items on the auction block. Here's hoping we will have Mr. Wolaver's Adirondack chairs once again!

The Lord's Acre Quilt has been an important part of our history also. It's an amazing piece of work that couldn't be done without the labor of women of our congregation. Words cannot express how much we appreciate their contribution.

As our building gets older and is used almost every day, it is in need of repairs each year. Because of the Lord's Acre Day, we have been able to pay off the current sanctuary's building note. We are now working on the parsonage note and loans that have been necessary for building improvements and repairs.

Over the last few months, we have completed the purchase and installation of 5 flat screen, wall mounted TVs in each of the Sunday School classrooms. The teachers have enjoyed using them and they have been quite convenient freeing up space in the Sanctuary for Allen's Sunday School class.

We have several children in Sunday School, with growing numbers over the past year. All of the current teachers plan to stay (Russ, Joanna, and Lynda) to start the new school year. ## **Stephen Ministry to Begin Soon**

Stephen Ministry is one-to-one lay caring ministry. Stephen Ministry congregations equip and empower lay care givers – Stephen Ministers – to provide high quality, confidential, Christ-centered care to people who are hurting. We have several people in our congregation that served as Stephen Ministers in their previous congregations.

This is a very large undertaking for First Red Oak, and has been in the works for quite a while. Our church enrolled as a Stephen Ministry Congregation earlier this year.

Mary Brownlee and Sherry Doty attended Stephen Ministry Leadership training July 14-20th in Dallas. This was a **very** full, 50 hour week of learning, discovery and worship. The training was attended by approximately 325 Stephen Leaders from 40 states and 2 foreign countries. We are very excited for all that Stephen Ministry can be for our congregation. At the end of the training, a dedication banquet was held for the new Stephen Leaders, which Allen & Darlene Grant also attended.

A Commissioning Service will be held in our church in the very near future for the Stephen Leaders as we continue to plan and move forward.

As new Stephen Leaders, we, along with Allen Grant, have several tasks ahead of us, including:

- Build awareness of Stephen Ministry in our congregation & community
- Recruit and interview potential Stephen Ministers in our congregation
- Train those selected as Stephen Ministers

We are beginning the process of talking to adults in our congregation about their place within Stephen Ministry. Those Individuals who are interested in becoming Stephen Ministers will complete the application and interview process. Our Stephen Leaders will provide the 50 hours of training required of Stephen Ministers to those selected, over the course of several weeks, beginning in early 2014.

As we prepare for this opportunity to serve our congregation and our community, we ask for your continued prayers and support. Building the foundation for this ministry takes time, planning and effort. This is a long-lasting and difference-making ministry, and we are both grateful to be part of it.


Daniel's Den: EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE...Available 24/7 via the local law enforcement agencies or hospitals.

No "walk-ins". Our emergency shelter clients are provided with a hot meal, shower facilities, toiletries, clothing, and a warm bed. Our staff reviews any other needs and refers the client to the appropriate agencies to help them be restored to a productive life. Transportation assistance is available if we are unable to provide long-term housing for them in Ellis County.

**TRANSITIONAL HOUSING at Daniel's Den: Application approval and space availability required. Please call for an appointment.** This program provides housing for women (both single and with children) and legally married couples for up to six months. Our Samaritan House clients are provided with case management services, job search assistance, transportation, childcare and other needs as they arise. They are required to attend a local church of their choice, find employment and adhere to a savings plan in order to obtain permanent housing

**ANGEL TREE MINISTRY**—We provided Angel Tree Christmas presents for over 40 children of those in our Texas prison system. We continue to remember these children throughout the year for their birthdays. Angels will be placed in the foyer in November for Christmas Donations.

**NORTH ELLIS COUNTY OUTREACH (NECO)**—FUMC provides packages of 12 oz. pasta and canisters of oatmeal to the Outreach located in Red Oak on Hwy 342. Please bring your donations of food and put it in the basket in the foyer. We provided school glue bottles and backpacks for clients at NECO in the Red Oak area.
