We have at least some answers for you. Welcome to Sunday School and Bible Studies at FUMCRO.







It's an average of about \$366 per person.

- Registration Cost = \$4050

TALENT SHOW/FUNDRAISER BENEFIT FOR MISSION





Answering the Why

The recent tragedy in Japan lifts up again a perennial question as to why. This is especially a pointed question to Christians with our belief in an all-knowing and all -loving God. Years ago Rabbi Kushner wrote a bestselling work entitled *Why Bad Things Happen to Good People*.

Abingdon Press has just published a new book entitled *Why?* written by Rev. Adam Hamilton, Senior Pastor of Church of the Resurrection UMC in Kansas City. It wrestles deeply and faithfully with this tough issue. A variety of secular publications have picked up on Rev. Hamilton's book. Recently, Adam wrote an article entitled *Japan's Earthquake and the Will of God*.

Allow me to share a sampling: "As a pastor, I've spent 25 years working through the problem of suffering with my congregation. While it is natural, in the midst of intense grief and loss, to blame both God and ourselves for terrible tragedies (God is punishing me for something I've done/God is punishing our nation for something we've done), these answers miss the mark.

From a Christian theological perspective there are two challenges to this view: The first is that the Bible consistently teaches that God is loving, merciful and just. There is nothing loving, merciful and just about thousands of people being buried alive in mudslides or rubble or washed out to sea by a tsunami. There is nothing loving, merciful and just about a child being born with cancer, or a young person being raped and murdered. These acts of violence and widespread destruction are inconsistent with the character of God. Further, when considering whether these acts may be punishment for human sin, the central focus of the Christian gospel, which the present season of Lent is pointing us towards, is that Jesus Christ bore the punishment for human sin on the cross, there offering a prayer that would echo throughout history, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." The answer to the question why is not to be found in a vengeful God who wreaks havoc on the human race. It is to be found in understanding that we live in a world of cause and effect. Our actions can have negative consequences for us or others. Others actions can have negative consequences for us. We also know that our bodies are not indestructible, and that there are genetic and external factors that affect our health. These can be exacerbated by our lifestyle and actions. And we know that there are forces of nature at work in our planet – atmospheric, environmental and geological — that are destructive. These very forces, which can be so destructive when human beings are in their path, are also essential to our planet being able to sustain life. Our actions as human beings can exacerbate these forces, but the forces themselves are a part of our planet's essential operating system." Even better, I invite you to read the book and lead a study group in your church through this thoughtful and helpful piece of writing.

QUARTERLY REPORT

Sometimes I have mixed emotions; I suppose that some of you do as well. This article has given me mixed emotions. Most people don't like to hear about our finances, but at the same time, it is only fair to keep the church informed of our physical condition as we try to do our spiritual condition. So let me start with the latter.

Spiritually, we are growing and learning. New people are beginning to come to church, some older members are starting to return and at the same time, many of our members are actively involved in carrying the ministry of Christ into the world. Our Parent's Day Out Ministry is growing and breaking even financially. Visitors are showing up every week at worship and the other activities during the week are growing. We are open for business 98 hours per week. WOW! Ministry is happening here in Red Oak and around the world because of you and your faithfulness.

At the beginning of 2011, I asked you to consider increasing your offering by 20%, which meant if you gave \$20 per week, then the increase would be \$4 per week. Or if you gave \$200 per week, then the increase would be \$240 per week. I am thrilled to report that several of our members have done exactly that and as your Senior Pastor, I want you to know that I greatly appreciate your faithfulness in giving.

Here at the end of the first quarter, our projected income should be \$94,170 so we could pay all of our bills and move ahead for the year. So far this year we have received \$85,374, which means we still need another \$8,796 to be even. Last year, we received a little over \$13,000 from the Waxahachie District to pay out our connectional giving and so far this year we have paid \$8,000 on our mission work beyond our local church.

First, let me say that all bills that are due are paid. We still owe some every month, but we are not trailing behind. Then, second, I want to say how incredibly proud I am of our staff. Each of them works hard to keep spending under control.

We are now in the middle of the Lenten Season – a time of prayer and preparation for Easter. I would like to ask you to pray again over your gifts to the church. Remember that special offerings for Japan, Haiti, Mission Trip and so many others are important but those should come after we pay our tithes and offerings to God.

We are almost \$9,000 behind in our offerings. With an average attendance of 150 adults, if each of us could pay an extra \$58.67 we would catch up and be able to be even. I know for some that may be a lot. All I am asking is for you to pray about the on-going ministry of your church this week. Thank you for being such a gracious and faithful people. God has blessed Darlene and me by calling us to this place of service.
