Lord's Acre Day started at this church in 1957 when some dedicated church members wanted to raise money for the church.

Different forms of donations came in and were auctioned off. At our previous location a pen was set up on the parking lot with livestock. George Ogelsby donated a calf that had to be rounded up in the mud! Wallace Cockerham donated bales of cotton. He brought samples to be bid on and then delivered the full bales. Beautiful handmade furniture & pieces of needlework have always been 'heated' items on the auction block.

The Lord's Acre Quilt has been an important part of our history also. It's an amazing piece of work that couldn't be done without the labor of several women of our congregation. It is hard to tell them how much we appreciate their contribution. In the coming weeks there will be a list of the winners of the quilt for you to see.

Because of the Lord's Acre Day we have been able to pay off the current sanctuary's building note. Also, we have paid different notes for upgrade and fix ups. We are now working on the parsonage note!

For the past several weeks, the Gospel of Luke has been leading us to an understanding of just how much Christ asks of us as his disciples. He wants us to give it all away. He wants us to take risks and help strangers, even our enemies. He wants us to look for turning points where we might meet God and be changed ourselves.

Our world is seeking hope and help during this difficult economic time. We have that hope. So beginning next Sunday, August 8, the pastor will begin a series of sermons based on Bishop Robert Schnase's book, "Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations."

Look at those adjectives. They are not usually associated with hospitality, worship, missions, faith development and giving. These are powerful words. 


The Children's Council will present Bibles during the services to those children going into the third grade. If you have a child going into grade 3 please inform the church office so that no one is left out.


NORTH ELLIS COUNTY OUTREACH



Have you ever found yourself listening in church and wondering about when we are going to arrive at our spiritual destination? When is it going to be enough? When are we just going to be able to sit back and relax and know that we have accomplished our tasks, the goals are reached and the work is done?

Of course, the answer is obvious. Our spiritual work is never done. We are and should be always seeking ways to grow closer to God. Wesley called that "going on to perfection." He did not mean we could overcome all of our own sinfulness by ourselves but with the grace of God we can move toward that perfect image of Christ in whom we were created (remember the Genesis story that we were created in the image of God).

So right now, I am asking you to join me in creating a culture of making disciples of Jesus Christ. That does not involve a new program or curriculum but developing a way of life that leads all of us to look for ways to share the gospel. We will meet many people during the weeks of our lives. And those folks are also looking for instant religion so they can move on to something else. We don't have that. What we do have is a Savior who can transform their lives.
