PASSPORTmissions CAMPER/PARENT

General Dress Code:

Campers should dress modestly and appropriately, according to their size and developmental stage, the entire week of camp. While at camp, the following clothes are not permitted:

- No short shorts or short skirts
- No tight fitting clothes
- No clothing that is strapless, that has low-cut necklines, reveals midriffs or is considered low-riding or revealing should be worn at any time
- No shirts with inappropriate language/advertising
- Tank tops with thin straps (such as spaghetti straps) may be worn only at the pool

Swimsuits:

All swimsuits should be modest. Girls may wear a T-shirt over two-piece suits. If campers are wearing swimsuits during other activities, they should wear clothing over them.

Worship Dress

Campers who are leading in worship (reading scripture, singing, praying, etc.) wear jeans, slacks, dresses, or nice, long shorts or skirts to worship. Other campers may dress according to the regular dress code.

Mission Project Dress:

Modest shorts and comfortable shirts with sleeves for mission projects. Campers need to wear closed-toe shoes, have access to sunscreen, a hat, and bug repellent.

Castaway Cove Dress:

There will be no boxers showing allowed and no cross-dressing. Appropriate undergarments are required for all campers.

PASSPORT reserves the right to ask the *individual Group Leader* to have a camper return to the dorm at any time to change clothing.

PASSPORTmissions CAMPER/PARENT

Please Remember:

1. For insurance reasons, we do not allow junior high campers to work on ladders over 6 feet tall.
2. You can help by praying daily for camp while your church group is with us.
3. You must have the Medical Release Form signed by a Notary Public so a hospital can treat you in the rare event of an emergency when you are unconscious.
4. There is a small camp store where campers can buy items such as T-shirts and hats if they would like.

What to Bring:

- Clothes: Plenty of T-shirts and shorts, some dressier clothes for worship (including a pair of pants or a dress), dance costume
- At least one pair of closed-toe shoes (*Crocs don't count*)
- Sweatshirt or light jacket.
- Sleeping bag (or consult your Group Leader for sheet size), pillow
- Towels and Linens: towels (hand and bath), and a washcloth for the week
- Toiletries: soap (for the sink and shower), shampoo, deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.
- Bible and pen/pencil
- Mission Project items: T-shirts with sleeves (required), work gloves, bug repellent, water bottle, sunscreen, hat and appropriate (closed-toe) shoes

What NOT to Bring:

- Please discourage youth (and other adults) from packing prank items like shaving cream or water balloons. Campers will be held responsible for property damage or clean up costs incurred.
- No use of illegal drugs, tobacco products, firearms, or alcohol will be tolerated at camp.
- We ask that electronics be switched off and put away for the WEEK of camp. This is a rule designed to allow youth to focus on God, camp, relationships and themselves - not games, music or texting. If you have a long drive and need these devices to survive the trip, please lock them up when you arrive at camp.

**The Day 3 Party is Free Time with your Church from 2:30-9 pm. You are encouraged to do something fun together, with dinner on your own. Worship will be at 9 pm on Day 3.

Theme: TREASURE. ask. seek. knock.

How do you find treasure? Where is the map? What secret key opens the lock, and what will we find inside? Gold doubloons, bejeweled necklaces, ancient artifacts, strings of pearls? Jesus promises something far more valuable, lasting, and mysterious.

PASSPORTmissions campers' search for true treasure this summer will be fun and faith-building. To guide us on our quest, our theme verse comes from Jesus' teaching in the Sermon on the Mount:

**"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find;
knock and the door will be opened to you." (Matthew 7:7, TNIV)**

We will learn how to ASK for that which delights God, SEEK God's Kingdom, and KNOCK at the door Jesus opens and invites us to enter... and where new adventures begin!

Bible Study

The 4 main daily themes of the Bible studies are as follows:

- **Treasure** (Day 1): "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Matthew 6:21 (TNIV)
- **Ask** (Day 2): Take delight in the Lord and he will give you the desires of your heart. Psalm 37:4 (TNIV)
- **Seek** (Day 3): Then Jesus turned, and seeing them following, said to them, "What do you seek?" John 1:38 (NKJV)
- **Knock** (Day 4): "For everyone who asks receives; those who seek find; and to those who knock the door will be opened." Matthew 7:8 (TNIV)

Mission Projects

Mission Projects vary by location and week and may include ministry with seniors or children, with various community agencies, with home repair or maintenance ministries, or ministry with poor or homeless people.

Parties

Each evening, PASSPORTmissions will have a party with one goal: FUN. We need your help to get your campers prepared for the parties: e.g., encourage them to come up with an act for the Variety Show, provide a corporate opportunity to create a costume for the Dance, or help them to remember to pack old clothes for the Rec Party.

Night 1: Treasure Hunt Rec Party

Hunting for treasure takes skill, strategy, determination, and team effort. And hey—it's a ton of fun! PASSPORTmissions campers will enjoy a set of challenges all designed to see which group will be left holding the treasure. Everyone competes within their Bible Study Group, which means teamwork and team spirit are keys to success. Campers and Adults should expect to play hard and sweat it out to claim the prize. Everyone should dress in shorts, T-shirts and tennis shoes (required) for this evening's fun.

Night 2: Castaway Cove Dance

Shipwrecked and marooned! The Castaway Cove Dance Party promises to be full of adventure and fun! Come dressed tastefully as your favorite island castaway (Pirate, Sailor, Gilligan's Island Crew, Lost, Hawaiian Shirts, Bermuda Shorts, Flip Flops, etc.). Much of the success of the dance will depend on the creativity of the campers in their Castaway Attire. Staff judges will determine which campers are the true Castaways. Games will be available for those who wish not to dance—like a Hula Hoop Contest, the Limbo, a Treasure Hunt, etc. *New this year—snacks and drinks will be available for a small fee (\$1 and under).*

Veteran campers will come in costume for this event. Please encourage your youth to join in the fun, so they don't feel left out. A group trip to the local thrift store would be a fun way to prepare for this party. See the Dress Code on the *Camper/Parent Info Page*.

Special Note: Youth Leaders, there will be a special award given to the youth group who is able to bring a decorated volleyball that best represents their youth group. (Think of "Wilson" in the movie *Castaway*!)

Throughout much of the week, your campers are divided into different groups for Bible Study and Missions, and while this is done with intentionality to build a broader community, it is also important for your group to build community internally as well. On the third full day of camp, groups will be given time off from 2:30 to 9:00 PM to participate in an activity of their choosing. Dinner will be on your own and we ask that you are back on campus ready to worship at 9:00 PM. We will offer suggestions as to where to go along with any coupons we can gather prior to your arrival at camp.

Night 4 Party: Reformed Pirate Cruise Line Variety Show

What can a pirate crew do when they realize the error of their ways? Turn their ship into a luxury cruise line, of course! The captain and his mates will host an evening everyone will treasure as campers present their acts. Who will be chosen as this year's cruise line entertainers?
