We all have different kinds of attachments in life, but can these attachments make us happy all of the time? Definitely not. Jesus is drawing our attention to the very fact that true happiness comes from inheriting eternal life. Jesus talks about a good young man who comes to Him and asks what he must do to inherit eternal life. He protests that he has kept all of the commandments, so Jesus tells him, "go sell what you have and give it to the poor, then come follow me." But his face falls at these words, and he goes away sad, for he is a man of great wealth. Jesus looks around and tells His disciples, "How hard it is for those who are rich to enter the kingdom of God!"

Jesus needs not ask every rich man to share his possessions with the poor, since there are many valid ways to follow Him. But He asked it of the young man because Jesus wants us to be detached from the things which are hurdles in our way to embrace eternal life. And in this case, his fidelity to Jesus demanded of him to assume the life of poverty to which the Lord had called him.

What the Lord does demand of all the rich is not to place their trust in money, but to use their wealth in the service of justice and brotherhood. We need to reflect in our lives, as well, our priorities. The toughness of Jesus' teachings is well manifested in the reluctant reaction of the wealthy youth.

In Christian life, the starting point is always the discovery of Jesus and the gospel as human fulfillment, which makes it possible for us to "leave all things" that are incompatible with our following of Jesus and have a clear orientation about our Christian lives. 

Respect Life Eucharistic Procession at the Cathedral-October 13th, 2024


Respect Life Month Theme: "I Came That They Might Have Life"

St. Mary's Cathedral and the Diocese Pro-Life Office will host the 3rd annual Respect Life Eucharistic Procession from 3:00 to 4:00 PM on Sunday, October 13th, 2024. We will process around the campus and around the neighborhood. This is a wonderful opportunity during Respect Life Month to give honor and praise to our Lord and to be the Light of Christ in the public square. We pray for our Nation and our State to stop the killing of babies in the womb. All are invited to attend.

While ending legalized abortion remains our preeminent priority, the most immediate way to save babies and mothers from abortion is through prayer and thoroughly surrounding mothers in need with life-giving support and personal accompaniment. This is creating a *Culture of Life*.

St. John Paul II said: "In firmly rejecting to *kill our children* ('pro-choice') it is necessary to become courageously 'pro woman,' promoting a choice that is truly in favor of women who need our care and protection. The only honest stance, in these cases, is that of radical solidarity with the woman. **It is not right to leave her alone**." He continued:


