In today's Gospel, Jesus prepares His disciples about His suffering and resurrection. The disciples were not paying attention to His words, rather they were busy talking about their positions and status. Even on asking, they did not reply to Jesus about their discussion on the way, but Jesus knows that the disciples are arguing about who is the greatest among them. Who has the most power? They fret about the questions of precedence. Jesus takes the power paradigm and puts it standing on its head. He took a child and tried to make them understand the spirit and meaning of His followers. The model of greatness in the Kingdom of God is the powerless child. Jesus demonstrated the kind of attitude He expected of His followers.

In that society, children were greatly loved, but they had no social status. They depended totally on the goodwill of their elders. The child has no degrees, wealth, achievements – which we seek to make us "somebody" great, but which in fact make us rivals, competing and jealous of one another. We are constantly seeking things that divide us.

We are very slow to understand what Christianity is all about. As Jesus explains to his apostles about the cross and resurrection, He teaches us too, sometimes, the same thing happens in the communities of the church.

Jesus seizes the opportunity in order to stress one of his basic teachings: those who appear to be first in the church must act with humility in service of their brothers and sisters.

May God enrich us all to be humble disciples to practice our faith by serving others. Amen. Blessings and Peace, Fr. Robin Bashir


