



God's love and care is amazing. His love is beyond our understanding because it is pure, unconditional and without favoritism for all the people. The prophet Isaiah speaks to the people in their captivity in Babylon, and gives them hope and courage. God came to liberate and restore them. God's salvation is expressed in terms of healing the blind and the deaf, the lame and the mute. That is what Jesus fulfilled. People brought a man before Jesus. Probably his friends supported him to reach Jesus. This poor man of the gospel was a deaf-mute. He could not make himself heard. Jesus sees the pain and suffering of a person who is deaf and mute and because of his impediments, he is unable to communicate with others. Jesus took him off by himself, away from the crowd, so he may hear and feel God's loving touch in his life. Jesus delivers him from his infirmity; one who is speechless can now speak. What a gift Jesus gave him. Here we can see a symbol of liberation of those who are oppressed in society – those who have no voice to express themselves and take part; the ones who are not counted.

We also need to get away from the crowd each day to spend a little while in silence with the Lord so that He heals our spiritual deafness. Jesus' healing power continues and never ends; therefore, spending time with the Lord and meditation is aform of listening in which we make ourselves temporarily deaf to the noises of this world, so that we can be more sensitive to the deeper sounds by which the one who made the universe and who dwells in the depth of our hearts speaks to our inmost souls.

"Happy Birthday to blessed Mother Mary," may she always intercede for us to her Son that He opens the ears of our hearts to His word and to spread His impartial love to all in need.




