*Parks and Recreation Master Plan
Public Information Meeting Notice
Thursday, October 22, 2015*

There will be a Public Information Meeting held on Thursday, October 22, 2015 commencing at 6:30 p.m. in the Main Meeting Room, at the Farmington Town Hall, 1000 County Road 8, Farmington, New York 14425. The purpose of the meeting is to provide a brief overview of the Draft Beaver Creek Master Plan thus far and provide the opportunity for public input upon the Beaver Creek Park Master Plan Drawings, a part of the ongoing update to the Town of Farmington Parks and Recreation Master Plan.

What is Beaver Creek Park? It is 87 acres of dedicated parkland, with proposed walking trails, ball fields, tot lots, pavilions, a lodge and parking facilities surrounding the Auburn Meadows Subdivision Tract, the Estates @ Beaver Creek Subdivision Tract and the Monarch Manor Subdivision Tract. The Park design will enable connections to the Auburn Trail Project that is also another ongoing recreational facility located adjacent to these neighborhoods.

Where is the Park Located? It is a series of parcels that are located north of the Canandaigua/Farmington Town Line Road, east of New Michigan Road, south of County Road 41 and southwest of the abandoned Penn Central Railroad Line.

Where can I learn more about this Park Planning Project? Meeting minutes and the various concept drawings that have been discussed by the Committee over the past few months are found upon the Town's website www.townoffarmingtonny.com. In addition, the revised Concept Plan for Section 1 of Beaver Creek Park, the main park area, has been posted on the website for your review.
