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RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SETTLEMENT OF PENDING TAX CERTIORARI ACTION BY RECOVERY SOLAR 1 LLC AND GREEN MOUNTAIN ELECTRIC SUPPLY, INC.

WHEREAS, a tax certiorari proceeding was commenced by Recovery Solar 1 LLC and Green Mountain Electric Supply, Inc. ("Petitioners") regarding property located at 6025 Denny Drive in the Town of Farmington ("Property") challenging Petitioners' assessment on the final tax assessment roll filed in 2023 and the action is currently pending in Ontario County Supreme Court (Index Number: 136596-2023) ("Pending Action"), and

WHEREAS, New York State recently mandated Towns apply a valuation model approved by the State to determine the value of solar energy facilities and this model results in values that are significantly lower than those computed based on the valuation methods previously utilized by assessors; and

WHEREAS, based on the lower value resulting from the application of the State's models, negotiations for settlement were entered into regarding the Pending Action, Petitioners have agreed to a proposed disposition and the attorney for the Town in this matter and the Assessor have recommended the settlement, finding that the proposed settlement is in the best interests of the Town, and now, therefore, it is

RESOLVED, that the Town Board authorizes a settlement with Petitioners that reduces the 2023 assessment from \$1,296,000 to \$168,000, that waives the application of RPTL \$727 and that states that Petitioner agrees not to challenge the 2024 - 2026 assessments if the 2024 assessment does not exceed \$158,000, the 2025 assessment does not exceed \$148,000 and the 2026 assessment does not exceed \$138,000, and that entitles Petitioners to any and all refunds and interest that would have been paid on the original 2023 assessment; and it is further

RESOLVED that the proposed settlement is in the best interests of the Town; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor and the attorney for the Town are authorized to prepare and execute all documents necessary to finalize the settlement; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk forward copies of this Resolution to Sheila M. Chalifoux, Esq., Chalifoux Law, PC, the Assessor's Office, and the Accountant I.
