RESOLUTION: Authorizing the Town Highway Superintendent to Purchase two (2) Solar Powered Pedestrian Activated Cross Walk Signal Units, Model B2B RRFB and related Equipment for completing authorized work as part of the Auburn Trail Extension Project (PIN 4755.96)

WHEREAS, the Town Director of Planning and Development (hereinafter referred to as Project Manager), the designated Town Project Manager for the Auburn Trail Extension Project, has received approval from Jay Reisenger, Local Projects Liaison, Region 4 Office of the New York State Department of Transportation, to purchase two (2) pedestrian crossing signals for the Auburn Trail Project crossing of County Road 41; and
