VISION:

The American Museum of Philippine Art Foundation, Incorporated (AMPAFI) is envisioned to manage and administer the leading museological institution devoted to the promotion, appreciation, and patronage of Philippine Art in the USA. The institution is also envisioned to promote Philippine-American Art in the US and around the world.







MISSION:

AMPAFI shall put together under a single exhibitionary and/or curatorial program, the works of artists from the Philippines, as well as migrant artists from the Philippines who are now in the US, as well as in other countries and territories.

These works shall then be exhibited and exposed to various audiences in the US for the purpose of promoting their aesthetic, historical, social, and economic value in the US, as well as their contribution to the enrichment of American art and culture

RATIONALE

The project started with the need to make Philippine Art visible in the United States. Compared to Western Art, Latin American Art, and African Art, Philippine Art has very little name recall, and is almost invisible in the consciousness of the average American museum visitor. Yet, historically, Philippine Art has had greater visibility to American audiences.


