



Above is the main meeting room displaying about half of the 130 attendees. At the Podium is our Master of Ceremonies Frank Boal who opened our 51st Annual Outstanding Kansas Citian Award Banquet and greeted everyone at about 7:00 p.m.

Frank then welcomed our OKC Honoree Matthew Naylor and his wife Tere. He then welcomed all of our NSDKC Past Presidents and asked for them to stand and be recognized.

Frank then asked for all NSDKC
Officers and Board Members to stand
and be recognized with special
recognition and appreciation for our
2024 President-Elect Christy
Chester, who is serving as Chair of
the OKC Committee again this year!

Lastly, **Frank** asked for everyone to rise and join in the Pledge of Allegiance. **Past-President John Hess, Jr.** came to the Podium and led our invocation.

M/C Frank Boal then returned to the podium and announced that our wonderful Dinner was being served!

At 8:15 **Frank** returned to the Podium and thanked the Carriage Club for our Dinner and began the agenda for our Awards Program.

His first action was to introduce Past-President Ross Marshall who presented the history of Native Sons and Daughters of Greater Kansas City, as follows.

Beginning in 1932 as *The Native* Sons of Kansas City, our organization evolved as *The Native Sons of Greater Kansas City*, and then in 2005 to *The Native Sons and Daughters of Greater Kansas City*.

One of the earliest projects was the restoration of Union Cemetery, and another was the reconstruction of Fort Osage overlooking the Missouri River in eastern Jackson County...now a historical site operated by Jackson County, Missouri.

Our vast collection of records and materials are archived with the State Historical Society of Missouri to further our mission to record and assure that our local history is preserved for future generations.

Over the decades, NSDKC has created and installed over 70 plaques and post-mounted markers detailing the rich historical heritage of our greater Kansas City region.

Again, our organization is in its 91st year of serving our community. If you are not already a member, we hope you will join us. No, you do not have to be born here to be a member...just simply have an interest in preserving our past...as did those civic leaders who came together nine decades ago to preserve our history for future generations.

Since 1973, we have honored 59 men and women with our distinctive Outstanding Kansas Citian Award. Tonight, we add the name of **Dr.**Matthew Naylor to that list. Thank you for being part of that recognition!

M/C Frank Boal then returned to the Podium and introduced our 2022 OKC Honoree Mark McHenry.

After Mark's remarks, he introduced our OKC Honoree Dr. Matthew Naylor, who very warmly accepted the 2023 Outstanding Kansas Citian Award.

**Frank** then returned to the Podium and invited prior OKC recipients who were present to stand at their table. Several did and were soundly applauded!

NSDKC President-Elect Christy Chester came to the Podium and invited our 2022 OKC Awardee Mark McHenry to come and present the special OKC Award Medallion to our 2023 OKC Awardee Dr. Matthew Naylor.

M/C Frank Bohl stepped back to the Podium and congratulated everyone and invited to the Podium 2014 President and NSDKC's Historical Markers Committee Chair Ross Marshall to briefly describe NSDKC's Historical Markers Program.

The Native Sons and Daughters of Greater Kansas City have a total of 60 Historical Markers in place now.


17 plaques of various sizes are mostly on walls or buildings with text.

43 are large upright markers on posts, with text on both sides. Our first one was in 1964. These include the ones we have dedicated in recent years in honor of our Outstanding Kansas Citian Awardees.

We have a public Dedication Ceremony for each marker and many of you have attended those events. We are expecting to have at least two in the coming year. We will publicize the date as usual and invite you all to come!

This year, in honor of our 2023 Outstanding Kansas Citian Dr. Matthew Naylor, we are working on a Historical Marker that explains the History and Heritage of the fabulous NATIONAL WWI MUSEUM and MEMORIAL as a tribute to the Museum and Dr. Naylor. The text has not completely been finished and agreed upon by all parties, so we had a text poster that essentially displays the text as shown above!

We will soon order the marker to be manufactured and delivered to us. We hopefully will have
