
Historical Markers Committee Report

- 1. **Union Station** Our OKC marker was shipped October 9 and will arrive shortly, well ahead of our November 6 OKC event. The people at Union Station wanted a back side different text and have paid us the \$450 for it.
- 2. **Board of Trade** Text work is nearly done, working with former CEO Walt Vernon. Steve Noll is working with PortKC, which is the owner of the property where the Board of Trade was located years ago, to formally approve our marker on the site and where we think it ought to be placed. We will have a meeting with the owner's representative in the near future. The cost is being covered by Steve Noll.
- 3. **KC Fire Department** Ray Elder is leading the work on the text along with Gary Hicks and Ross Marshall, and it is in the final stages. The cost is being covered jointly by the Kansas City Fire Department and Local 42 Union.
- 4. **Garrison School Museum** The Museum people, Chris Sizemore, Gary Hicks and Ross Marshall are working on finalizing the two-sided text. We are getting close. Cost is covered by the Museum.
- 5. **Steptoe Neighborhood** Sponsored by Whitney Kerr. Text work will begin soon.

NSDKC website markers pages are getting improvements

The installation of new markers research information and new pictures of the markers onto our website is being handled by Frank McMillian. Ross Marshall and Frank have met and Frank will be starting the work shortly at a reasonable fee. It should not take long, because he already has a model setup that will work for each marker.

Our very dear friend and long-time leader in NSDKC, Dr. Charles "Chuck" Alan Eddy, passed away on September 5, 2019 after battles with several ailments. Chuck Eddy served NSDKC as a Board member and officer for many years including being our president in 2013. He currently was our Business Manager and leaves a void that many of us are trying to fill.

Chuck was very active in the Kansas City area, having served as a Captain of the reserve unit in the KCMO Police Department for 24 years, City Councilman of the 6th District in 1999-2007 and many other important positions within City Hall. He played a key role in budgetary decisions that helped pave the way for Bartle Hall, Sprint Center, the Power and Light District and other downtown businesses.

One of Chuck's many passions was music. He loved to sing, play the drums and be a DJ. His band played at many NSDKC key events for many years including the Annual Outstanding Kansas Citian Gala and the Annual Holiday Brunch.

Chuck was a practicing Chiropractor for 50 years in his own office, graduating from Cleveland Chiropractic College.

Chuck touched a lot of people and organizations in Kansas City in his 71 years and will be sorely missed by them and by his wife Donna, other family members and all of us at NSDKC.

We will keep you informed about Monument Programs for 2020.



In the design process of the NSDKC Monument, the use of large granite pavers was selected for lasting distinction and correspondence with nearby granite surfacing of a reflecting pool located in Ilus Davis Park.

Springtime through fall in Kansas City are the best seasons to accommodate field inscription work at the Monument! Have you considered ordering an inscription in tribute to your parents, or early family settlers of our region? Or as a tribute for a special achievement? Or simply to note with your name an appreciation of the history and heritage of our greater metropolitan region. This is the season to get your order placed for an inscription at the Monument.

Level 2 \$500.00: 1" Text. Text Zone Size: 12" x 18", 4 Rows Maximum, 24 Characters per row Maximum

Level 3 \$1,000.00: 1-1/4" Text. Text Zone Size: 12" x 27", 5 Rows Maximum. 31 Characters per row Maximum

Level 4 \$5,000.00: 1-1/2" Text. Text Zone Size: 18" x 27", 5 Rows Maximum. 25 Characters per row Maximum

Level 5 \$10,000.00: 1-3/4" Text. Text Zone Size: 24" x 36", 6 Rows Maximum. 30 Characters per row Maximum
