I wish to thank this year's Board of Directors and the Executive Secretary for a job well done. When Union
Station was built in 1914,
few knew that one interesting feature never came to
fruition. Front and center of
our great landmark sits a
pedestal that was meant to
include a statue. Unfortunately, it never materialized.

Ninety-one years later, the Native Sons decided to do something about it.

The Native Sons, with participation from Union Station, the Truman Library and the City of Kansas City, agreed that our 33rd President and esteemed Kansas City area native Harry S. Truman should grace this prominent pedestal that has sat empty far too long.

Renowned artist Bruce Wolfe to create a sculpture that would capture the essence of Harry S. Truman.

Our goal is to raise \$450,000 dollars to fund the creation and installation of the long overdue statue by the summer of 2006.

To date, with the help of Senator Talent and The Native Sons of Kansas City, we have made good progress, but we still need help from the Kansas City community.
