George Brett named 2013 Outstanding Kansas Citian

B aseball Hall of Famer, George Brett, has been named our 2013 Outstanding Kansas Citian. Brett, who played his professional baseball career for the Kansas City Royals, made baseball history during his 21-year career and has been active in Kansas City business and sports projects since his retirement in 1994.

The selection of George Brett to receive the 2013 OKC award continues a tradition that began in 1973 to recognize our contemporaries who have placed Kansas City in the history books.

George Howard Brett is an extraordinary Kansas Citian. His accomplishments have forever placed Kansas City in the annals of baseball history. Born in 1953, Brett began minor league play in 1971 and was brought up to the Royals in August of 1973. He continued to play for the Royals until his retirement in April of 1994. His baseball awards and records are many -- he is one of four players in major league baseball history to accumulate 3,000 hits, 300 home runs and a career batting average of .300.

This year's award ceremony is scheduled for November 6 in the Diamond Club at Royals Stadium.

Historical Markers

2013 is another busy year for the NSDKC Historical Markers Committee! Last year we produced and dedicated the Liberty Arsenal marker and presented a plaque (one-sided) marker to the American Jazz Museum.

In 2013 the committee, composed of Chris Sizemore, Frank McMillian, Gary Hicks, Craig Crease, Ray Elder and Whitney Kerr, Jr., is working on three marker projects.

The first is the Platte Purchase marker which will be installed on the north side of Liberty. We are progressing toward finishing the text and it will be ordered and dedicated later this year. This marker will commemo-

rate the 1837 Platte Purchase which added the six counties in northwest Missouri.

The second is a plaque marker for Janssen Place, which is a historic residential area, part of Hyde Park, just east of 36th and Gillham Road in Kansas City. This is an 1897 street of mansions two blocks long, begun by Arthur Stilwell, railroad magnate.

The third is a plaque marker to be presented to the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum during our Outstanding Kansas Citian event November 6. It will be similar to the American Jazz Museum plaque marker of last year and mounted next to it, since the two museums are in the same building at 18th and Vine.
