bove is the new marker installed last October on the south side of Johnson County Arts and Heritage Center Museum by The Native Sons and Daughters of Greater Kansas City. This is the 40th upright marker NSDKC has installed in the Greater Kansas City area in recent decades, but our first in Johnson County!

Because of the Pandemic, NSDKC was not able to dedicate it until the evening of April 21 at 5:30.

Eilert and **Myers** will be honored as NSDKC's 2021 Outstanding Kansas Citians at a Gala on November 9 at Overland Park Convention Center.

After the unveiling of the marker, the crowd numbering over 80 people went into the Museum for the dedication. Normally NSDKC dedicates markers outside, but because of the cold weather we went inside to a very nice assembly room.

The crowd was seated in spaced-out chairs in four well-separated rows. Both **Susan** and **Mary**, as part of their remarks, presented wonderful videos of the Center, its history and the large displays and historical information that are available to visitors.


On May 19th, NSDKC presented Chester Owens, a well-known KC

Thanks also to Director Mary MacMurray, the event held inside was exceptionally successful in spite of the weather outside being chilly.









The last speaker was **Phil Taggart**, Operations Manager and Senior Project Manager for Area Real Estate Advisors which now occupies the former Board of Trade building. Phil was very supportive and helpful throughout this project and even personally dug the hole himself for the marker post!

Normally the last segment of a marker dedication is to unveil the marker, but that was not possible this time. The marker was installed at 49th and Main next to the building, but just slightly out of our sight. Besides that, it was raining!
