

Marker Dedication to honor our 2019 OKC honoree George Guastello, Union Station President and CEO - October 28 at 10:30 a.m.



Pictured above is Union Station, the location of the dedication of our marker on Wednesday, October 28 at 10:30 a.m. The dedication will be near the right (east) side of the Station, the location of the installed marker. Free parking will be available at the east end of the parking lot in front of the Station.

George Guastello was honored at our OKC Gala last November 6 as our 2019 Outstanding Kansas Citian for all his accomplishments as the President and CEO of Union Station. The marker was displayed at that event as is our usual practice. Our marker dedication was planned for spring of 2020. However, the Covid-19 Pandemic hit us in March prohibiting the dedication ceremony.

We will have several speakers who will make brief remarks from a podium with a microphone and amplifier. After Garrison School, this will be our second marker dedication this year.

Union Station is a great setting, and this will be a fun event! Please wear masks and observe social distancing. We have plenty of room. Plan to come and join us for this incredibly special ceremony!

2020 OKC "Heritage of Johnson County" Marker to be installed



hese are crazy times! Yes, the above headline is not in error!

Rather than just eliminate the year 2020 from all our OKC annual procedures, we decided to proceed ahead and order the 2020 OKC marker that honors our 2020 OKC honorees, who are Commissioner Ed Eilert and General Richard B. Meyers (RET). The text was already finalized by the markers committee.

The marker is to be installed at the Johnson County Arts & Heritage Center (above) at 8788 Metcalf in Overland Park. The Center is also the location of the Johnson County Museum. This marker will be the first NSDKC marker to be located in Johnson County, Kansas!

The basic location for the marker will be where the photographer is standing, which is the entrance from the large parking area. This marker location will be highly visible to everyone who enters and/or leaves the Center!

We had planned to have the marker dedication this fall and Mary McMurray, the Director, wanted very much to have a nice reception inside the Center immediately after the dedication. However, Covid-19 restrictions are still in place and since this site is a Johnson County site, Mary has requested on advice from County officials, that we postpone the dedication and reception until next spring.

Rather than have the marker stay in storage for another six months, we have decided to install the marker so that it is visible to the public for education and inspiration. That installation will be completed by the middle of October.

At the 2021 OKC Gala, which will be held at the Convention Center on November 9, 2021, we will unbolt the marker and display it on a stand in front of the attendees as we always have in the past. In addition, the marker will be presented to our honorees, Mr. Eilert and General Myers, as we always have done in the past. When the Gala is over, the marker will be re-installed on the same post at the Arts & Heritage Center.

We will advise you concerning the date of the marker dedication and reception next spring when that date is set. As stated above, these are unusual times, but it all will work out eventually!

NSDKC Board Meetings Resumed

It's time to order your NSDKC **Monument Inscriptions**

n April 2018, NSDKC dedicated its new Monument located in Ilus Davis Park at 10th and Oak, KCMO. This Monument was designed, built, and dedicated to all who placed their hands on the history and heritage of the Greater Kansas City metropolitan area. NSDKC is grateful to our local philanthropists who, through their generosity, made this half-million dollar project possible!

As the picture shows, in addition to its star-shaped tower, one of the Monument's primary elements is its 30-ft diameter, granite paved plaza area. This area allows for inscriptions by individuals and businesses to be engraved representing the pride of being Kansas Citians; to honor family members or membership within NSDKC! To date, nearly 60 personalized inscriptions have been engraved in the plaza area! The purchase of inscriptions defrays the costs of the architectural fees to prepare design drawings required to construct the Monument!

Inscriptions on the large pavers are done in the field with the same quality and expertise as if they were done in the shop. There are five pricing levels for inscriptions below: (See picture for examples)

Level 1 \$250.00: 1" Text. Text Zone Size: 6" x 9", 3 Rows Maximum, 13 Characters per row Maximum

Level 2 \$500.00: 1" Text. Text Zone Size: 12" x 18", 4 Rows Maximum, 24 Characters per row Maximum

Level 3 \$1,000.00: 1-1/4" Text. Text Zone Size: 12" x 27", 5 Rows Maximum. 31 Characters per row Maximum

Level 4 \$5,000.00: 1-1/2" Text. Text Zone Size: 18" x 27", 5 Rows Maximum. 25 Characters per row Maximum

Level 5 \$10,000.00: 1-3/4" Text. Text Zone Size: 24" x 36", 6 Rows Maximum. 30 Characters per row Maximum

NOTE: Since the Monument plaza area does not use standard 'red' bricks, designated zones are applied for each level. The larger the zone size, the larger the text size, and more rows of text are available for the engraving!

The inscription setup & purchase is simple:

Option I: Use the online process through the NSDKC website www.nsdkc.org/nsdkc_monument to layout your inscription Level #3 at top, level #2 at bottom and order. Payment can be through Level #1 at upper right one of the online payment services offered.

Garrison School marker dedicated July 24

The first dedication of an NSDKC historical marker in 2020 was on Friday evening, July 24 at 6:30 p.m. at the Garrison School Cultural Center. The location is about five blocks north of the Liberty Courthouse on Main St.

There was an hour-long meeting in the School building with various speakers including Liberty Mayor Pro Tem Michael Hagen and other political leaders of Missouri and Clay County.

NSDKC President Dick Retrum presented a Certificate of Appreciation to the Clay County African-American Legacy, Inc. (CCAAL). Both Dick and NSDKC Markers Committee Chair Ross Marshall presented brief remarks about NSCKD and our historical markers program.

The 35 or so attendees wore masks for the meeting inside the School and outside at the unveiling as well.

The marker was funded by CCAAL with a grant from the City of Liberty. The school is listed on the National Registry of Historic Places and the registry of historical sites of Clay County.

Garrison School was established in 1877 to educate Black youth of Liberty and continued to serve African American students until it was integrated following the Brown vs. Topeka Board of Education decision. The CCAAL purchased the school from the Liberty School District in 2003. Today, the school provides a home for CCAAL to present ongoing programming for Clay County residents and the Greater Kansas City area.

The marker dedication was also a part of the Juneteenth Celebration at Garrison.

Our other markers existing in Liberty are the Liberty Arsenal, Weekly Dale Farm and Liberty Cemetery (Wm Jewell College).

A special thanks to former NSDKC Vice President Chris Sizemore who worked with Ross and our markers committee for more than a year to complete this project.
