Location: Place where the historic property was constructed as the place where the historic event occurred.

Design: Combination of elements that creates the form, plan, space, structure, and style of the property.

Setting: Physical environment of a historic property.

Materials: Physical elements that were combined or deposited during a particular period of time and in particular pattern or configuration to form a historic property.

Workmanship: Physical evidence of the crafts of a particular culture or people during any given period in history or prehistory.

Feeling: Property's expression of the aesthetic or historic sense of a particular period of time.

Association: Direct link between an important historic event or person and a historic property.
