

Fairy ornaments and miniature accessories are not toys. If not handled with care they could break. Some items are hazardous to young children due to the pointed ends, sharp edges or very small size (choking hazard). You may prefer to bend/curl the ends of the wire picks. We recommend that you keep any items of concern out of reach of young children and supervise play. Having said that, children of all ages can enjoy playing in their fairy garden. Our two year old daughters love to 'garden' with the mini tools - put water in the watering can, sand in the bucket, or simply rearrange the furniture!

When positioning your items outdoors, a sheltered area is ideal to reduce weathering. Anything made of metal and kept outdoors will rust, eventually. On many items this natural weathering adds to the charm and beauty, but not on others. If an item does begin to rust, simply sand/clean away the rust and repaint or seal with a protectant. We recommend coating your items with polyurethane water based varnish (available at craft and hardware stores). This will also help reduce fading of your fairies and other painted resin and clay items. The frequency of recoats will vary depending on the position of the item. If located in our harsh summer sun all day, you will need to recoat more often than an item kept sheltered. Wooden items should be kept dry. Glazed and fired clay items will not weather.
