VILLAMANTA LEGAL CHALLENGE

Villamanta are now representing approximately 2,000 individuals at VCAT challenging the board and lodging increase. Administrators State Trustees and Judge and Papaleo have also consented to Villamanta acting on behalf of their affected clients.

Ben von Einem and Viv Avery of Villamanta advise affected parties not to co-operate with the financial planning process or sign hardship applications as the content of each is currently subject, in part, to a VCAT challenge.
