The Bombers started the game strongly, and it was quickly apparent this would be a tough four-quarter match. Trailing by 8 points at the first change, our play was very competitive. However, our attack on the ball only resulted in three goals up to half time. Coming out after the main break with a deficit of 11 points, I asked the boys for an extra gear of effort and to attack up the middle of the ground.
