### A message from the owner:

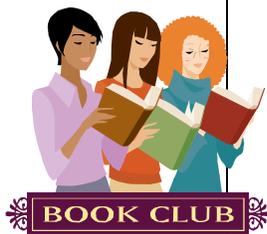
In the words of Bob Dylan, “the times they are a-changin’.” The Maryland State Department of Education was recently awarded a Race to the Top Early Learning Challenge grant (RTT-ELC) from the federal government. The project brief of Maryland’s 10 RTT-ELC projects can be found here <http://tiny.cc/ig1siw>. The full application and details, along with an executive summary can be found on the [MSDE website](#).

How will the RTT-ELC effect you as a childcare provider?

- The Maryland EXCELS project is the state’s version of a Quality Ratings and Improvement System (QRIS). EXCELS will impact all licensed childcare programs, school age care programs and family childcare providers. Field tests for EXCELS begin this fall. Full implementation is expected sometime in 2014. - Professional development:
  - [Maryland Model for School Readiness](#) training is part of the RTT-ELC proposal. In the coming year, this training will be updated and revised to align with newly adopted Common Core State Standards. [Innovations in Education, LLC](#) is proud to be a significant contributor to the revision of the [MMSR training](#).
  - An emphasis on the implementation of Social Emotional Foundations of Early Learning (SEFEL) training
- Use of developmental screening tools and professional development to support the use of such tools. Currently under development is [Best Beginnings](#).
- An expansion of the capabilities of the Child Care Automated Tracking System (CCATS) to allow for more licensing and credentialing processes to be completed by providers online.

The next few years will see some significant changes to the Early Childhood Education field in Maryland, all with the intent of increasing the level of quality care that is provided to our children. 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## Following the Lead of the Child

There is a lot of talk about emergent curriculum and following the lead of the child, but what does that really mean, and what does it look like? Before you can implement an emergent curriculum approach, or even begin to follow the lead of the child, it's important to identify what you believe.

- Do you believe children are competent and capable?
- How do you show children you respect them?
- How do you show children you trust them?
- In what ways does your environment support each child's development and needs?
- Does your space represent the children who spend their days there?
- Does the flow of your day match the needs of the children?

To follow the lead of the child, caregivers should be able to answer the above questions. A big challenge for many adults is recognizing that if we follow the lead of the child, we will not have planned for everything. We will not be able to control everything that happens. The organizational structure we've set for our day may not be followed. We may be outside of our comfort zone.

If we can step back and focus on what the children are saying or doing, really focus on how they interact with each other, with us, and with the world around them, then we can start to understand and follow their lead.

## ***Professional Learning Communities (PLCs):***

PLCs offer participants a chance to study together, learn from each other, and take ownership of the learning in a way that traditional workshops do not. A trained facilitator helps guide the PLC participants through the learning process using articles, books, activities, and participant experiences.

Each PLC meets once per month for 1.5 - 2 hours. Participants are expected to complete readings and assignments in between sessions. The following topics will be offered this year:

**Emergent Curriculum:** Meets the first Tuesday of each month, beginning October 2, 6:30-8:30pm

*Questions to explore:* What is curriculum? What is emergent curriculum? How do you get started? How do you build relationships with children and families? How do you plan for emergent curriculum? How do you set up the environment, incorporating materials, DAP, play, children's interests, etc.?

**Core of Knowledge: 5 CD, 12 CUR, 3 SN, 3 PROF, 1COM (24 hours total)** (\$150 for 24 hours of training)

**Social Emotional Development:** Meets the second Monday of each month, beginning October 8, 6:30-8:00pm

*Questions to explore:* What are your personal beliefs and experiences with guidance and discipline? How do your beliefs shape your relationships and interactions with children and families? What is social-emotional development and why is it important? How do you provide supports for ALL children? How do the 6 life skills fit into your program? What resources and teaching strategies can be used to further support children?

**Core of Knowledge: 3 CD, 6 CUR, 2 SN, 3 PROF, 1 COM (15 hours total)** (\$120 for 15 hours includes text)

## ***Online Training***

October 8 – November 11 (\$95 / 15 hours COK)

### **The Big Picture: Learning About Children Through Observation**

Participants in this online training will explore the connection between observation and assessment of young children in a developmentally appropriate manner. Participants will explore various methods of observing young children and tools for recording observational data. This workshop will provide participants with strategies for becoming effective, responsive observers. The online course includes videos, articles, and hands-on experiences. An interactive community of learners helps provide support in completing this workshop.

November 12 – December 9 (\$80 / 12 hours COK)

### **Using the Internet and Technology as a Professional Tool**

Participants will gain a greater understanding of how to utilize the Internet and other technologies to enhance family communication, professional development, and curriculum. By the end of the 4 weeks, participants will have had many opportunities to read about and use technology in their programs. The online community of learners will be able to share their progress and challenges over the course of 4 weeks, with continual feedback from the facilitator. By week 4, participants should feel more confident in their ability to access technology and utilize it to their advantage for overall personal and professional improvement.

November 26 – December 23 (\$80 / 12 hours COK)

### **The Value of Play**

The foundation for implementing developmentally appropriate practice is creating an environment where young children learn through play. This workshop explores how to create an environment that supports learning through play. Participants will explore what "learning through play" means, what it looks like, and how to actually implement this in their programs. An interactive community of learners helps provide support in completing this workshop.

## 2012 MMSR Training – Maryland Model for School Readiness

The MMSR provides a framework for best practices in early care and education programs. Through the MMSR, teachers gain an in-depth understanding of children's learning styles and capabilities allowing them to probe more deeply into their students' learning potential. ## Registration Policies

- **ALL workshop participants MUST pre-register.** There will be NO exceptions. Participants are required to register and pay for workshops in advance. Participants may register online, by fax, or by mail. All payments must be received prior to the start of the workshop. ***Walk-ins will NOT be accepted.***
- **Registrations are accepted in the order in which they are received.** You will receive a confirmation notice within one week of the date your registration was received. If your registration is received less than one week prior to a workshop, you will receive confirmation by phone.
- **Training Voucher/Reimbursement:** As a participant in MSDE's Maryland Child Care Credential program, childcare providers are eligible for training vouchers that will help pay for the cost of training workshops. A Training Voucher form must be submitted to MSDE at least 60 days prior to the start of training. With a voucher, training costs will be paid directly to the training organization. Training Reimbursement is available for approved training that has been completed within the past four months. Training will be reimbursed by MSDE, directly to you. Innovations in Education, LLC will work with you to figure out which option will work best for your situation. We will also provide the necessary forms for Vouchers and Reimbursements. Our trainers will also assist you in completing the necessary forms at each workshop. For Training Reimbursements, we will gladly assist in submitting the necessary paperwork. *Please remember to include your childcare license/ registration number on the workshop registration form.*
- **Refund policy:** We recognize that situations change, but our instructors must plan and prepare for workshops in advance. Refund requests must be made at least **one week prior** to the scheduled workshop. Unless otherwise noted, all refund requests are subject to a \$5 administrative fee.
