SERMON TEXT- Mark 7:24-37

²⁴[Jesus] set out & went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house & did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, ²⁵but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, & she came & bowed down at his feet. ²⁶Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophoenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. ²⁷He said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food & throw it to the dogs." ²⁸But she answered him, "Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." ²⁹Then he said to her, "For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter." ³⁰So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, & the demon gone. ³¹Then he returned from the region of Tyre, & went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. ³²They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; & they begged him to lay his hand on him. ³³He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, & put his fingers into his ears, & he spat & touched his tongue. 34Then looking up to heaven, he sighed & said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." ³⁵And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, & he spoke plainly. ³⁶Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. ³⁷They were astounded beyond measure, saying, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear & the mute to speak."

LISTENING TO ...

GOD- Christian life is rooted in the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit

- 1. The Gentile woman & man are of a similar type: sociologically she has no voice to be heard; medically he cannot hear or use his voice. How do they connect to Isaiah 35:4-7a? What are we hearing about Jesus' kingdom (cf. 1:14-15)? See Luke 4:10-22; Romans 10:12; 1 Corinthians 12:13; Galatians 3:28; Colossians 3:11
- St. James exposes our greedy, covetous hearts (James 2:4) in attending to others. Jesus subverts all this in the gospel lesson (cf. 7:20-23). How do the woman & the man illustrate what St. James writes in James 2:5? See Matthew 5:1-12, 25:31-46; Romans 6:3-4

EACH OTHER- Sharing & growing with our brothers & sisters in Christ

- 3. Compare this story with Mark 2:3-5, 5:22-45, 6:56. For whom are you interceding with God? Make a list of 3-5 specific persons for whom you are praying & specifically what you are praying for. How will you know the outcome? Keep track of the progress on your list.
- 4. Are your prayers for real possibilities or wishful imagining? Will the desired outcome benefit the person best or your & your sense of importance? How can you adjust your intercessions appropriately?

NEIGHBORS- Bearing fruit for those not yet our brothers & sisters

- Those around Jesus in the Bible are often put off or threatened by the outsiders different from themselves (cf. Matthew 11:16-19). St. James sternly warns us against this (James 2:1-13). Spend time in prayer each day this week asking the Holy Spirit to reveal the small & narrow places in your "comfort zone". Ask him to bring you to repentance & to open (v34) your zone.
- Notice how deeply humanizing Jesus' two interactions are. In what ways is your congregation listening to its neighbors? How is it gently touching them or "hands-on" in their lives? How can you serve to help in these ways?
