SERMON TEXT- Nehemiah 8:1-3, 5-6, 8-10

¹All the people [of Israel] gathered together into the square before the Water Gate. They told the scribe Ezra to bring the book of the law of Moses, which the Lord had given to Israel. ²Accordingly, the priest Ezra brought the law before the assembly, both men & women & all who could hear with understanding. This was on the first day of the seventh month. ³He read from it facing the square before the Water Gate from early morning until midday, in the presence of the men & the women & those who could understand; & the ears of all the people were attentive to the book of the law. ⁴And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, for he was standing above all the people; & when he opened it, all the people stood up. ⁵Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, & all the people answered, “Amen, Amen,” lifting up their hands. Then they bowed their heads & worshiped the Lord with their faces to the ground. ⁶So they read from the book, from the law of God, with interpretation. They gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading. ⁷And Nehemiah, who was the governor, & Ezra the priest & scribe, & the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, “This day is holy to the Lord your God; do not mourn or weep.” For all the people wept when they heard the words of the law. ⁸Then he said to them, “Go your way, eat the fat & drink sweet wine & send portions of them to those for whom nothing is prepared, for this day is holy to our Lord; & do not be grieved, for the joy of the Lord is your strength.”
