SERMON TEXT- Psalm 1 Lutheran Book of Worship translation

¹Happy [is the one] who [has] not walked in the counsel of the wicked, nor lingered in the way of sinners, nor sat in the seats of the scornful! 2Their delight is in the law of the Lord, & they meditate on his law day & night. 3They are like trees planted by streams of water, bearing fruit in due season, with leaves that do not wither; everything they do shall prosper. 4It is not so with the wicked; they are like chaff which the wind blows away. 5Therefore the wicked shall not stand upright when judgment comes, nor the sinner in the council of the righteous. ⁶For the Lord knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked is doomed.

LISTENING TO ...

God- Christian life is rooted in the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit

- 1. It seems that Jeremiah is quoting this Psalm. What other connections do you find between these two lessons? In other words, what makes Psalm 1 a fitting inspiration for Jeremiah? Use your Bible's study
- 2. Ezekiel (47:12), & perhaps Isaiah, also seem to quote Psalm 1:3. How do the following expand & fill in this tree metaphor of the faithful? See Genesis 18:1-15; Joshua 24:14-26; 2 Samuel 18:6-15; Psalm 92:12-15; Isaiah 4:2, 6:9-13; 11:1-10, 61:3; Jeremiah 23:5-6, 33:14-17; Ezekiel 17:22-24, 47:12; Zechariah 3:8, 6:12-13; Matthew 2:23 (a word play on the Hebrew root word NZR/"branch"), 7:17-19. 12:33-35

EACH OTHER- Sharing & growing with our brothers & sisters in Christ

- "Happy" could also be translated "blessed" (cf. Luke 6:17-26; Matthew 5:1-12). In a culture of so many unhappy people (Christians & not) how would "holy happiness" improve your everyday life & the everyday lives of those around you? List at least 10 ways. What holds you back from this holy happiness? See Psalm 145:1-2, 146:2; Romans 12:12; Philippians 4:4; 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18; 1 Peter 4:13; James 1:2-4; for further reading, see Dennis Prager's bestseller Happiness Is a Serious Problem (Wm. Morrow Paperbacks, 1998).
- 4. V1 contrasts the righteous who follow God's plan with the wicked who have gotten loose & fallen into evil (this phrasing reflects the Hebrew vocabulary roots). How does this phrasing illustrate your own life? Give at least 3 specific examples. See Psalm 119:65-72, 113-120, 169-176; Isaiah 47:10-11; Matthew 7:13-14, 24:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:2; Titus 3:3

NEIGHBORS- Bearing fruit for those not yet our brothers & sisters

- The word scornful refers to same things as *Proverbs* 21:24, 22:10, 1:22; 9:7-8; 13:1; 15:12; that is folks who love conflict & reject good sense. Where do you find such behavior in your everyday life? How can you avoid "sitting in their seats"? With what can you replace your old seats among the scornful? How can your good example winsomely & kindly encourage others to do the same? Think about your own sitting & watching the news or scrolling Facebook...

- 6. The law-scoffing, libertine world ends up back around at a new tyrannical law that must be enforced: none shall fail to affirm, approve, & accept them. Consider John 3:16-21, 1 Corinthians 6:9-11; Galatians 5:16-21; Revelation 20:(4-6) 11-15. How is evangelism- introducing your friends to your friend Jesus- a necessary thing in your everyday life? See Romans 10:13-17
