PRAYER OF THE DAY

STUDY TEXT- Luke 9:28-36

²⁸Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter & John & James, & went up on the mountain to pray. ²⁹And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, & his clothes became dazzling white. ³⁰Suddenly they saw two men, Moses & Elijah, talking to him. ³¹They appeared in glory & were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. ³²Now Peter & his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory & the two men who stood with him. ³³Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, & one for Elijah"—not knowing what he said. ³⁴While he was saying this, a cloud came & overshadowed them; & they were terrified as they entered the cloud. ³⁵Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" ³⁶When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. & they kept silent & in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

LISTENING TO . . .

GOD- Christian life is rooted in the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit

- 1. Compare & contrast the Transfiguration lessons with those of Epiphany. (*Isaiah 60:1-6; Psalm 72:1-7, 10-14; Ephesians 3:1-12; Matthew 2:1-12; see also* Our Lord's Presentation (*Candlemas*) *Malachi 3:1-4; Psalm 84; Hebrews 2:14-18; Luke 2:22-40*). How do they work together to give a fuller, clearer picture of Jesus?
- 2. V31 speaks of Jesus' departure, his exodus in the Greek. What makes that terminology fitting for the last Sunday before Ash Wednesday & Lent? What does calling it his exodus add to the story?

EACH OTHER- Sharing & growing with our brothers & sisters in Christ

- 3. Read vv23-27. Jesus plainly tells us he is our first priority (cf. 1st Commandment*). Read also vv51-53; Jesus is clear that his first priority leads to the cross (cf. 22:42). How does everyday discipleship (incl. daily Bible reading & prayer, weekly worship & offerings) move you from "my will" to "thy will be done", that is, teach you to "listen to him"? See Philippians 2:3-8, 4:2; *Exodus 20:1-6; *Small Catechism available bookofconcord.org
- 4. How do we know that all of Scripture speaks to Jesus (2 Corinthians 3:14) & is to be listened to? See Matthew 10:35-36 (Micah 7:6), 13:14-15 21:13, 42, 22:43-44, 26:31; Luke 4:16-21, 22:37, 24:25-27, 44-48; John 6:45, 12:35-43, 13:18, 15:25; 2 Timothy 3:16-17

NEIGHBORS- Bearing fruit for those not yet our brothers & sisters

- 5. Moses is dead & buried (*Deuteronomy 34:5-7*) while Elijah ascended into heaven (2 Kings 2:11) yet here they are conversing (cf. 1 Samuel 28:8-15). How does this speak to the hope expressed at faithful, Biblical, orthodox funerals that the faithful deceased are commended into God's hands & that light perpetual shines upon them (cf. 2 Esdras 2:34-35*), until the actual day of bodily Resurrection? See Romans 14:8-9; Philippians 1:21-24; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; *Yes, Lutheran can faithfully read the Apocrypha, too
- 6. We live in a world of "fake news" where truth is measured by spin. Our motto could well be "Are you gonna believe me or your lying eyes?" How does St. Paul's commitment (2 Corinthians 4:2) to telling the truth & the Truth (John 14:6) leave us at odds with our neighbors who may or may not believe that "Science is real" or "Love is love" or other meaningless platitudes? By staying out of the madness, how are Christians then in a position to bring healing & reconciliation? See Matthew 5:1-11, 37-48; Romans 12:18; 2 Corinthians 5:18; 1 Peter 3:13-18; SC: Commandments 5-8
