SERMON TEXT- Luke 13:1-9

¹At that very time there were some present who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. ²[Jesus] asked them, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? ³No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. ⁴Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them—do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? ⁵No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did." ⁶Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; & he came looking for fruit on it & found none. ⁷So he said to the gardener, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, & still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?" ⁸He replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it & put manure on it. ⁹If it bears fruit next year, well & good; but if not, you can cut it down.""

LISTENING TO ...

GOD- Christian life is rooted in the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit

- 1. Fig trees (*Ficus carica*) generally don't require soil amendment, or irrigation, or even pollinators. What makes this parable such an effective illustration of God as "gracious & merciful, slow to anger, & abounding in steadfast love" (*Joel 2:13*)? See Ezekiel 33:7-11 (really, the whole chapter); 2 Peter 3:9
- God certainly expects good fruit (works) in the lives his believers. Lutheran doctrine teaches this clearly, too. See Luke 3:8-9, 6:43-44, 8:14-15; Romans 7:4-5; 2 Corinthians 8:8-15; Galatians 5:22-23; Ephesians 5:9-11; Colossians 1:6-10; James 3:17; 2 Peter 1:3-9; Formula of Concord-Solid Declaration IV:8-14; FC available bookofconcord.org Does A) God need them from us or B) do we need to offer them to him? Does God accept them A) because we're good people or B) for Jesus' sake? Are we supplying something A) God lacks or B) something our neighbors & the world around us lack? Support your answers with biblical & doctrinal evidence. Use your Lutheran Study Bible by Concordia Publishing House.

EACH OTHER- Sharing & growing with our brothers & sisters in Christ

- 3. Jesus point in *vv3*, 5 is that without repentance, all will perish (*cf. John 3:13-17*); he's not commenting on the particular guilt of the deceased (*cf. Job 42:7; John 9:2, 3*). How can your suffering lead others to repentance? *See Titus 2:7-8; 1 Peter 2:12-24, 3:8-18; Hebrews 13:18*
- 4. St. Augustine compared the manure to the sinner's sorrows & repentance. What are some areas in your life where your repentance is still raw, perhaps even tearful? How can they give you the compassion to help others facing similar life circumstances? Be specific.

NEIGHBORS- Bearing fruit for those not yet our brothers & sisters

- 5. Consider Jesus' corrective about the connection between suffering & immorality. When have you received better (or worse) than you deserved, especially in the big picture? How does that recalibrate your attitude toward your neighbors?
- 6. In the midst of tragedy, how might one's good works (or works of mercy) serve- not exploit!- the victims while showing & telling of something greater (*cf.* #2)? Come up with specific examples from your community or neighborhood. What stops you from doing such for your neighbors?
