- 6. Consider the *Revelation* readings of the Easter season: 1:4-8; 5:11-18; 7:9-17; 21:1-7; 21:10, 22--22:5; 22:12-17, 20-21. Notice the jump from *ch7* to *ch21*. How do they show & tell us that the main themes of *Revelation* are hope, worship, & eternal life, not politics, wars, fear, etc. as Jesus warns in *Matthew* 24:4-8? Also, remember the ancient Creeds reject millennialism ("His kingdom will have no end") and dispensationalism was made up in the 1830s. *See <u>SC</u>*: *Apostles Creed*
