SERMON TEXT- Hebrews 11:29--12:2

²⁹By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land, but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned. ³⁰By faith the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days. ³¹By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace. ³²And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David & Samuel & the prophets—³³who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, ³⁴quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. ³⁵Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. ³⁶Others suffered mocking & flogging, & even chains & imprisonment. ³⁷They were stoned to death, they were sawn in two, they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep & goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented—³⁸of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts & mountains, & in caves & holes in the ground. ³⁹Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, ⁴⁰since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect. ^{12:1}Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight & the sin that clings so closely, & let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, ²looking to Jesus the pioneer & perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, & has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

LISTENING TO . . .

GOD- *Christian life is rooted in the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit*

1. Familiarize yourself with this great cloud of witnesses recounted above. Use your study Bible notes to find the Old Testament stories. (vv33-34 seems to reference Ezra, Nehemiah, Daniel, & Meshach Shadrach, & Abednego; vv36-38 seems to reference the Maccabees from the Apocrypha. Yes, Lutherans have & can read the Apocrypha, too.) Also see #5 below.
2. Hebrews extensively uses by analogy the Old Testament sacrificial/Tabernacle/Temple system. (The Old Testament lesson was changed for us today.) What makes 1 Kings 8 (see also vv34- 30, 41-43) a good fit? See *Exodus 19:9, 24:15-18; 33:9-10, 34:5-7, 40:34-38; Romans 12:4-5; 1 Corinthians 6:19, 12:12, 27; 2 Corinthians 8:23; 2 Thessalonians 2:14; 1 Peter 2:5, 4:14*
