What can anyone do to me?" ⁷Remember your leaders, those who spoke the word of God to you; consider the outcome of their way of life, & imitate their faith. ⁸Jesus Christ is the same yesterday & today & forever. ¹⁵Through him, then, let us continually offer a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that confess his name. 16Do not neglect to do good & to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God. ¹⁷Obey your leaders & submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls & will give an account.
