The rich man also died & was buried. ²³In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up & saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. ²⁴He called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, & send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water & cool my tongue; for I am in agony in these flames.' ²⁵But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things, & Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, & you are in agony. ²⁶Besides all this, between you & us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, & no one can cross from there to us.' ²⁷He said, 'Then, father, I beg you to send him to my father's house— ²⁸Abraham replied, 'They have Moses & the prophets; they should listen to them.' ³⁰He said, 'No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' ³¹He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses & the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.'"
