SERMON TEXT- Genesis 32:22--33:4

²²The same night [Jacob] got up & took his two wives [Leah & Rachel], his two maids [Bilhah & Zilpah], & his eleven children* [Reuben, Simeon, Levi, Judah, Dan, Naphtali, Gad, Asher, Issachar, Zebulon, Dinah*, & Joseph] & crossed the ford of the Jabbok. ²³He...sent them across the stream, & likewise everything that he had. ²⁴Jacob was left alone; & a man wrestled with him until daybreak. ²⁵When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket; & Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. ²⁶Then he said, "Let me go, for the day is breaking." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go, unless you bless me." ²⁷So he said to him, "What is your name?" & he said, "Jacob." ²⁸Then the man said, "You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God & with humans, & have prevailed." ²⁹Then Jacob asked him, "Please tell me your name." But he said, "Why is it that you ask my name?" & there he blessed him. ³⁰So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, "For I have seen God face to face, & yet my life is preserved." ... ^{33:1}Now Jacob looked up & saw Esau coming, & four hundred men with him. So he divided the children among Leah & Rachel & the two maids. ... ³He himself went on ahead of them, bowing himself to the ground seven times, until he came near his brother. ⁴But Esau ran to meet him, & embraced him, & fell on his neck & kissed him, & they wept. ^{*}sons, plus his daughter Dinah; Benjamin, his 12th son, is not born yet; cf. 35:16-18

GOD- Christian life is rooted in the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit

- 1. Review Jacob in your study Bible & even on Wikipedia en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Jacob
- 2. Consider Hosea 12:3-5 (also Exodus 4:24-26); Luke 12:27-34, 13:24; 1 Corinthians 12:27--13:1 (13:2-8), 14:1; Colossians 4:12; 2 Peter 3:15; see also Isaiah 45:9. How is Jacob's wrestling match, striving with God, a model for us? What warning does Isaiah give? What do 1 Corinthians 9:24-27; 2 Corinthians 11:21-28 1 Timothy 1:18, 6:12; 2 Timothy 4:7 add?

EACH OTHER- Sharing & growing with our brothers & sisters in Christ

- 3. The metaphor of wrestling with God does not describe our poor disposition or bad attitudes because he won't give us what we want like spoiled children. Instead, it is a transformative experience as Martin Luther describes, "This happens through that faith which holds so firmly to God's Word, until it overcomes God's wrath & obtains God as the gracious Father" (WA DB 8:137). When has this happened for you? If not, what do you make of that?
- 4. Recall Jacob's interactions with Esau. What about Jacob must be transformed before their reconciliation? *See #1; Genesis 25:19-34, 27:1-45* What unreconciled relationships do you have hanging over you? What needs to be transformed about you for reconciliation?

NEIGHBORS- Bearing fruit for those not yet our brothers & sisters

- 5. Consider 1 Corinthians 10:13 (1-13, really) & the following citations. How can you speak encouragement & hope to someone who is struggling greatly- without being trifling, petty, trivial, or inane? See Romans 8:28-39; 2 Corinthians 12:8-10; Ephesians 6:12-13; 1 Thessalonians 5:24; 2 Thessalonians 3:32; Timothy 4:18; 1 Peter 5:8-9; 2 Peter 2:9 Try putting yourself in their shoes to see if you would want to hear your own sappy platitudes.
- 6. Jacob "owes" Esau for his trickery, hence the presents *vv1-4*, *13-21*. How can a gift or act of kindness help soothe troubled neighbors? How can it help them feel cared for in their troubles?
