SERMON TEXT- 1 Corinthians 1:10-18

¹⁰Now I appeal to you, brothers & sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement & that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind & the same purpose. ¹¹For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers & sisters. ¹²What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." ¹³Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? ¹⁴I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus & Gaius, ¹⁵so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. ¹⁶(I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) ¹⁷For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, & not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power. ¹⁸For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

LISTENING TO . . .

GOD- *Christian life is rooted in the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit*

1. St. Paul repeats his point in *v11* later in *11:18* (cf. *11:17-34*); what purpose does he see coming from the division? How does Paul envision a resolution in *12:1--13:13*? See also *Philippians 2:1-11*
2. Every New Testament book speaks of conflict/division between believers & what to do to reconcile it (ranging from encouragement to stay true to the Gospel to ending fellowship & avoidance). Nowhere is conflict, or troublemaking, endorsed, excused, or allowed. Where does St. Paul locate our essential unity?
