<sup>18</sup>The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. <sup>19</sup>For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, & the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." <sup>20</sup>Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? <sup>21</sup>For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. <sup>22</sup>For Jews demand signs & Greeks desire wisdom, <sup>23</sup>but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews & foolishness to Gentiles, <sup>24</sup>but to those who are the called, both Jews & Greeks, Christ the power of God & the wisdom of God. <sup>25</sup>For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, & God's weakness is stronger than human strength. <sup>26</sup>Consider your own call, brothers & sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. <sup>27</sup>But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is not, to reduce to nothing things that are, <sup>29</sup>So that no one might boast in the presence of God. <sup>30</sup>He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, & righteousness & sanctification & redemption, <sup>31</sup>in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

# LISTENING TO ...

## GOD- Christian life is rooted in the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit

- St. Paul uses "boast" about 54 times in his letters. Perhaps *Galatians 6:14* summarizes it best "May I never boast of anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, & I to the world." Consider particularly *1 Corinthians 4:7, 9:16; 2 Corinthians 10:17, 11:30, 12:9.* What is Paul advocating for or against? Use your Bible's study notes. See also Romans 3:21-28; 4:1-8, 5:1-11; <u>Small Catechism</u>: Creed 2, <u>Small & Large Catechisms</u> (#3 below) available bookofconcord.org
- Read 1 Corinthians 2:1-16 (& Ephesians 6:12). How does the unexpectedness of the Crucifixion (cf. Matthew 16:21-23) further St. Paul's point about not boasting in oneself, but only in Jesus? How is it easier to believe/trust in a "heroic" salvation/savior instead of what the gospels record?

Second, what do you think is really behind such an excuse? What were you avoiding or hiding when you made that excuse (or a similar one)?
