SERMON TEXT- Isaiah 50:4-9a

⁴The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens—wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. ⁵The Lord God has opened my ear, & I was not rebellious, I did not turn backward. ⁶I gave my back to those who struck me, & my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult & spitting. ⁷The Lord God helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, & I know that I shall not be put to shame; ⁸he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. ^{9a}It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty?

LISTENING TO ...

GOD- Christian life is rooted in the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit

- 1. Read the other "servant songs" from Isaiah. The context is the Babylonian Exile (500s BC); what do you think is going on with this servant? See Isaiah 42:1-4, 49:1-6, 52:13-53:12; see also 61:1-3; John 12:37-41. Hint: use a study Bible, Wikipedia, & a Bible commentary, if you have one
- 2. What verbal images in *vv4-6* suggest Jesus' humiliations during Holy Week? What words suggest that the Servant was always faithful to God? *Thanks, Light on the Lessons!* © 2017, *Lutheran Bible Ministries. All rights reserved.*

EACH OTHER- Sharing & growing with our brothers & sisters in Christ

- 3. Holocaust survivor Dr. Victor Frankl introduces readers to the concept of "redemptive suffering" in <u>Man's Search for Meaning</u>. In a nutshell, unavoidable suffering is reframed from pointless to significant when a future good or virtuous outcome can result from its path. (*Cf. American Cancer Society's "More Birthdays" campaign, or a couple whose "hard times" result in staying married, raising children, & encouraging others.*) Think back on five periods of significant suffering in your life; without trivializing or instrumentalizing them, what worse outcomes could have resulted & what better outcomes did occur? Note: "living to tell about it" is good outcome. *See en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Logotherapy#Discovering_meaning*
- 4. "Redemptive suffering" is also a Christian theological concept which directs one's sufferings to Jesus' own & finds spiritual union with him. Now reflect on those 5 instances above in spiritual matters; what worse outcomes could have resulted & what better outcomes did occur? What did you learn about God & his grace? *See 2 Corinthians 11:16--12:10, esp. 12:9; Galatians 6;17; Colossians 1:24*

NEIGHBORS- Bearing fruit for those not yet our brothers & sisters

- 5. So called middle-class values, especially "respectability" (with the neighbors), can often be at odds with the demands of the cross (v6); what do you think makes this so? *See Proverbs 29:25; Matthew 13:3-8, 18-23; Luke 20:46-47; Galatians 1:10*
- 6. How does worrying "what will the neighbors think?" prevent you & your congregation from "loving your neighbors as yourselves"? See vv8-9; Psalms 56:4, 11, 118:6; Luke 10:25-37; Romans 8:31
