Moreover the LORD declares to you that the LORD will make you a house. ¹²When your days are fulfilled & you lie down with your ancestors, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come forth from your body, & I will establish his kingdom. ¹³He shall build a house for my name, & I will establish he throne of his kingdom forever. ¹⁴I will be a father to him, & he shall be a son to me.
