¹I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, ²with all humility & gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. ⁴There is one body & one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, ⁵one Lord, one faith, one baptism, ⁵one God & Father of all, who is above all & through all & in all. ¹But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. §Therefore it is said, "When he ascended on high he made captivity itself a captive; he gave gifts to his people." (When it says, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? ¹¹He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.) ¹¹The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors & teachers, ¹²to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³until all of us come to the unity of the faith & of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. ¹⁴We must no longer be children, tossed to & fro & blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming. ¹⁵But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, ¹⁶from whom the whole body, joined & knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

How do the 10 Commandments, Creeds, & Lord's Prayer help you sort between the stakes of the Gospel & things further downstream from it (and things in between)? *See* **Small Catechism*; *1 Corinthians* 2:2
