Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. 14But if you have bitter envy & selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful & false to the truth. ¹⁵Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. ¹⁶For where there is envy & selfish ambition, there will also be disorder & wickedness of every kind. ¹⁷But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy & good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. 18 And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace. ^{4:1}Those conflicts & disputes among you, where do they come from? Do they not come from your cravings that are at war within you? 2You want something & do not have it; so you commit murder. & you covet something & cannot obtain it; so you engage in disputes & conflicts. You do not have, because you do not ask. 3You ask & do not receive, because you ask wrongly, in order to spend what you get on your pleasures. ⁴Adulterers! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God. ⁵Or do you suppose that it is for nothing that the scripture says, "God yearns jealously for the spirit that he has made to dwell in us"? ⁶But he gives all the more grace; therefore it says, "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble." ⁷Submit yourselves therefore to God.
