SERMON TEXT- Hebrews 10:11-25

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Almighty God, your sovereign purpose brings salvation to birth. Give us faith to be steadfast amid the tumults of this world, trusting that your kingdom comes & your will is done through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior & Lord. Amen.

¹¹Every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again & again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. ¹²But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, "he sat down at the right hand of God," ¹³and since then has been waiting "until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet." ¹⁴For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified. ...¹⁹Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰by the new & living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), ²¹and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²²let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience & our bodies washed with pure water. ²³Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. ²⁴And let us consider how to provoke one another to love & good deeds, ²⁵not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, & all the more as you see the Day approaching.

- 1. Review *Exodus 24:3-8, 40:12-15* (Old Covenant ceremony; priests' washing) *Leviticus 16:2-34* (atonement & entering Most Holy Place). How does *Hebrews* use these Old Testament ceremonies to show Jesus' sacrifice as fulfilling *Exodus 19:5-6* in a greater & perfect way? *See 1 Peter 2:9-10*
- 2. The devil loves to discourage God's people (consider *Job; John 8:44*). How do the following make the case for Christians' need to be encouraged together (v25)? See Acts 4:36, 14:22, 15:32, 16:40, 18:27, 20:2, 27:36; Romans 1:12, 15:4-5; Ephesians 6:22, 1 Thessalonians 3:7, 3:7, 4:18, 5:11, 5:14

EACH OTHER- Sharing & growing with our brothers & sisters in Christ

- Read about the connection between justification & good works. Review these passages from Jesus & St. Paul. What good works has the Lord prepared for you to do in your particular everyday life? See 1 Corinthians 12:1-11; Ephesians 2:10, 4:1-16; <u>AC</u>*XX <u>AP</u>*XX:92; <u>FC-EP</u>* IV; <u>FC-SD</u>*IV: 14-40
- 4. The Covid19 crisis collided with generational changes to decimate- or worse weekly- church attendance (cf. v25). "Committed" is now 1-2 Sundays per month plus occasional monthly activities. How does your attendance measure? Your church office can print your record. What is consistently more important than weekly worship in your everyday life? See Matthew 13:1-23, 24:42-51, 25:1-13; <u>Small</u>* & <u>Large Catechisms</u>*: 1st, 3rd Commandments

NEIGHBORS- Bearing fruit for those not yet our brothers & sisters

- 5. The Lutheran reformers were clear that God doesn't need our good works (*cf. Psalm 50:7-23; Hosea 6:6; Micah 6:8; Matthew 9:10-13, 12:1-13*), but our neighbors do. What good works in the neighborhood/community is your congregation known for? By the way, good works are not merely fundraising/disbursing or necessarily "charitable" in the sense of giving away things like food, clothing, etc. (Yes, those things are good to do, too.) See Luke 10:25-37; 2 Cor 8:1--9:15
- 6. "If you were accused of being a Christian, would they have enough evidence to convict?" goes the old saw. Review the <u>SC</u>*'s Table of Duties & <u>AC</u>* XVI:5. How do these change your perspective on a life of good works benefiting your neighbors? Remember, God gives us good works in everyday life, we don't make them up for ourselves.
